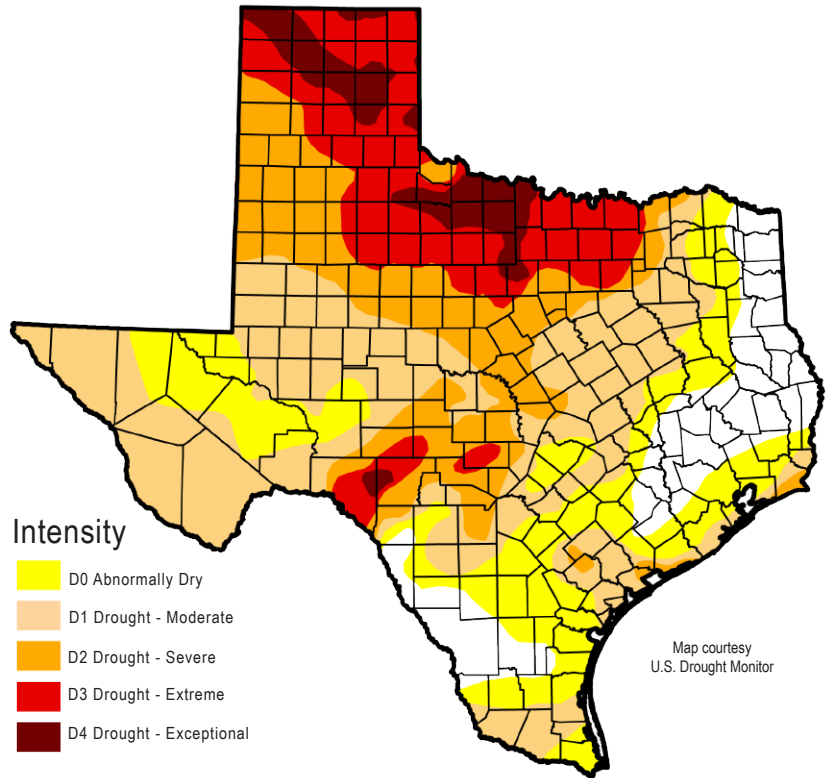


## DROUGHT CONDITIONS

It was another good water week for Texas! Above average rainfall in most parts of the state during the last month and a half has raised statewide reservoir levels. We are currently at 67.6 percent of capacity, the highest level since October 2012. We still have a ways to go, but reservoir levels in many parts of the state are going the right direction.

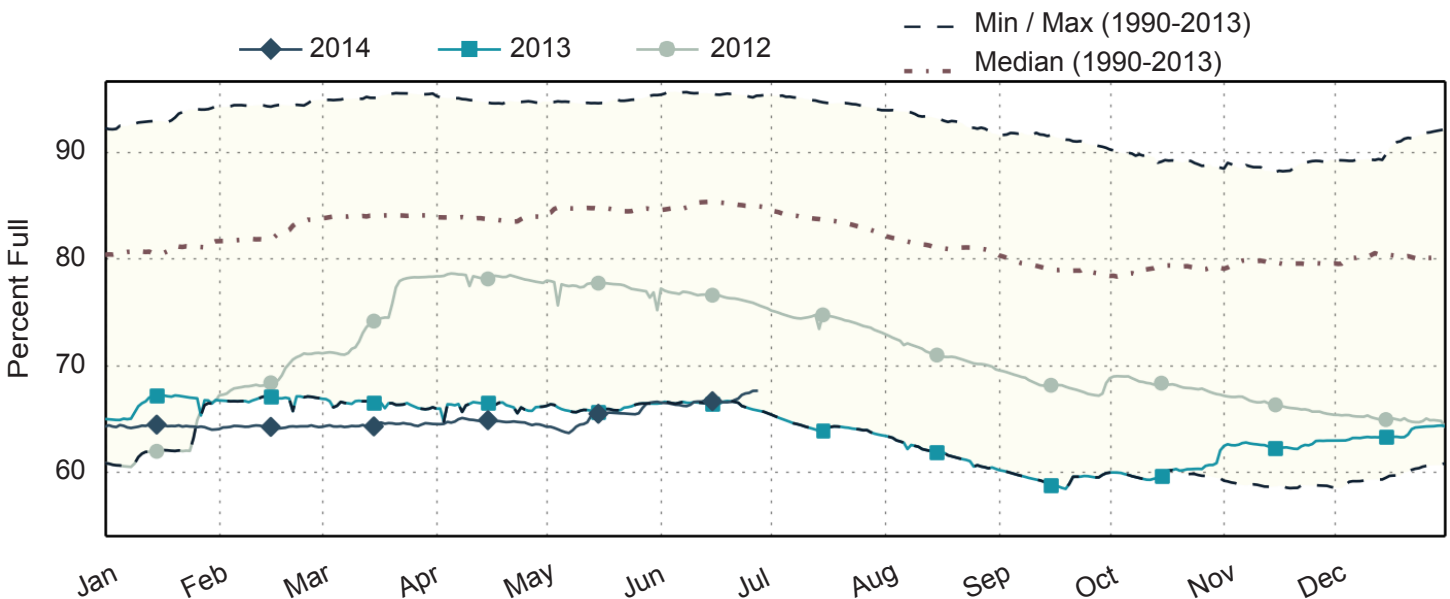
### Drought statistics

- 69% of state currently in moderate to exceptional drought
- 71% a week ago
- 67% three months ago
- 84% a year ago



## STATEWIDE RESERVOIR STORAGE LEVELS

For the first time since late January, current statewide reservoir levels are not setting new records for the lowest levels since 1990. Reservoir levels are still more than 15 percent lower than normal for this time of year.
