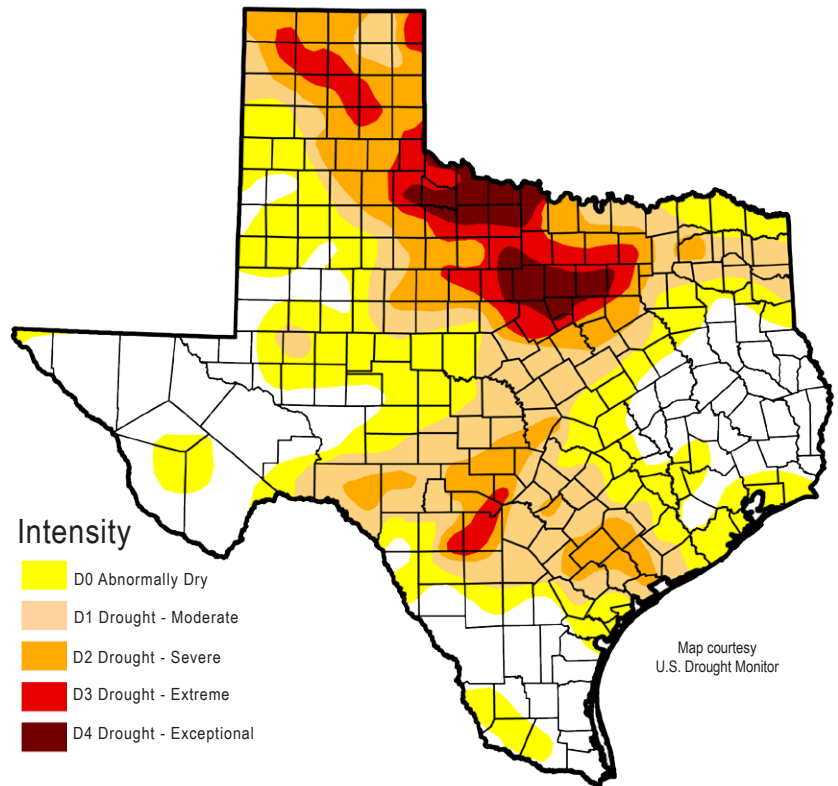


## DROUGHT CONDITIONS

As expected, recent rains improved drought conditions with the amount of the state in drought dropping four percentage points over the past week. Sadly, the rains didn't help statewide reservoir storage much: we are down 60,000 acre-feet for the week. However, in a bit of good water news, the Edwards Aquifer's J-17 well in San Antonio is up 10 feet.

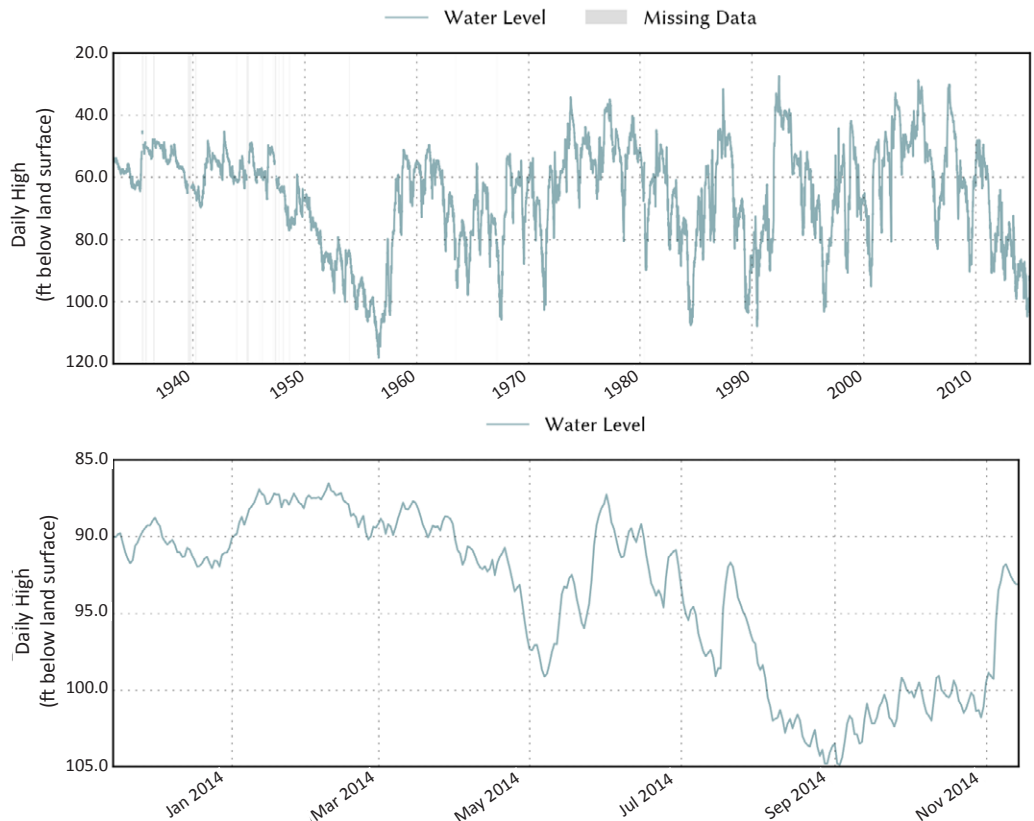
### Drought statistics

- 44% of state currently in moderate to exceptional drought
- 48% a week ago
- 58% three months ago
- 50% a year ago
