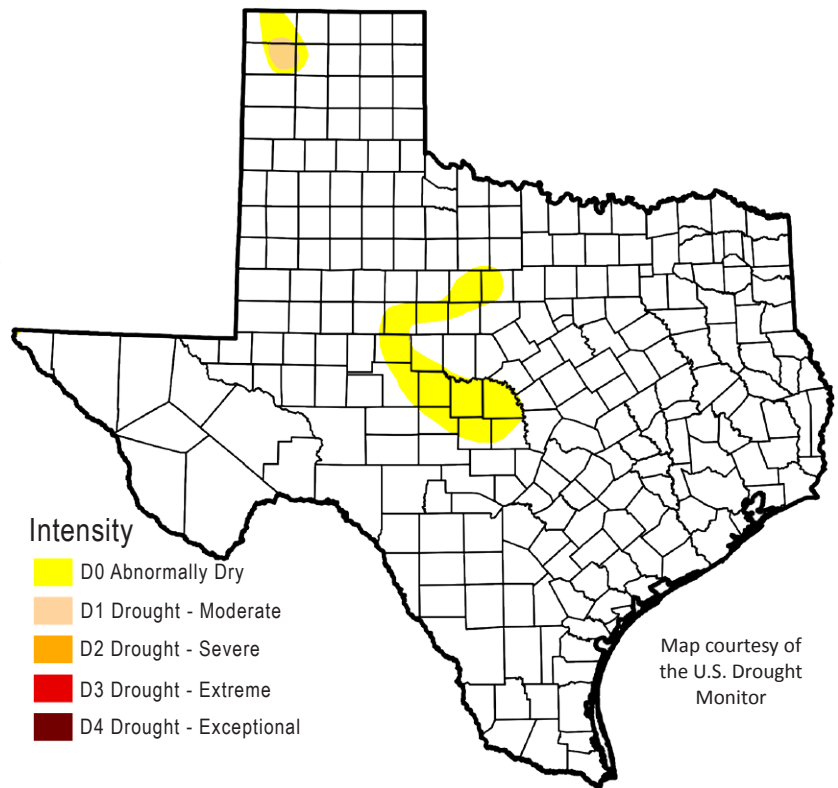


## DROUGHT CONDITIONS

Statewide reservoir storage continued its run of weekly increases, now at 20 weeks; however, some reservoirs continue to be low (for example, Abilene area: 28%; Midland-Odessa: 23%; San Angelo: 15%). According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, a tiny bit of drought still hangs on in the Panhandle.

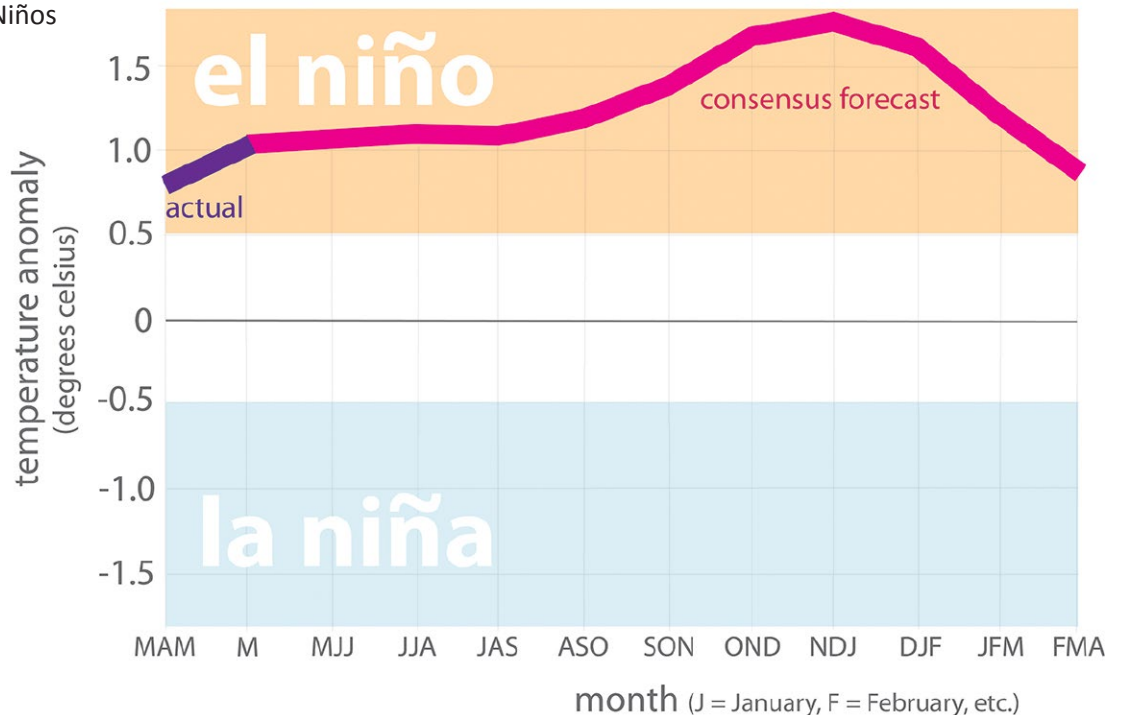
### Drought statistics

- 0.2% of state currently in moderate to exceptional drought
- 0.2% a week ago
- 36% three months ago
- 61% a year ago



## EL NIÑO FORECAST

The Climate Prediction Center projects a 90% chance that El Niño conditions will continue through the 2015-2016 winter and an 80% chance conditions continue into the spring. El Niños correlate with wetter winters and springs.
