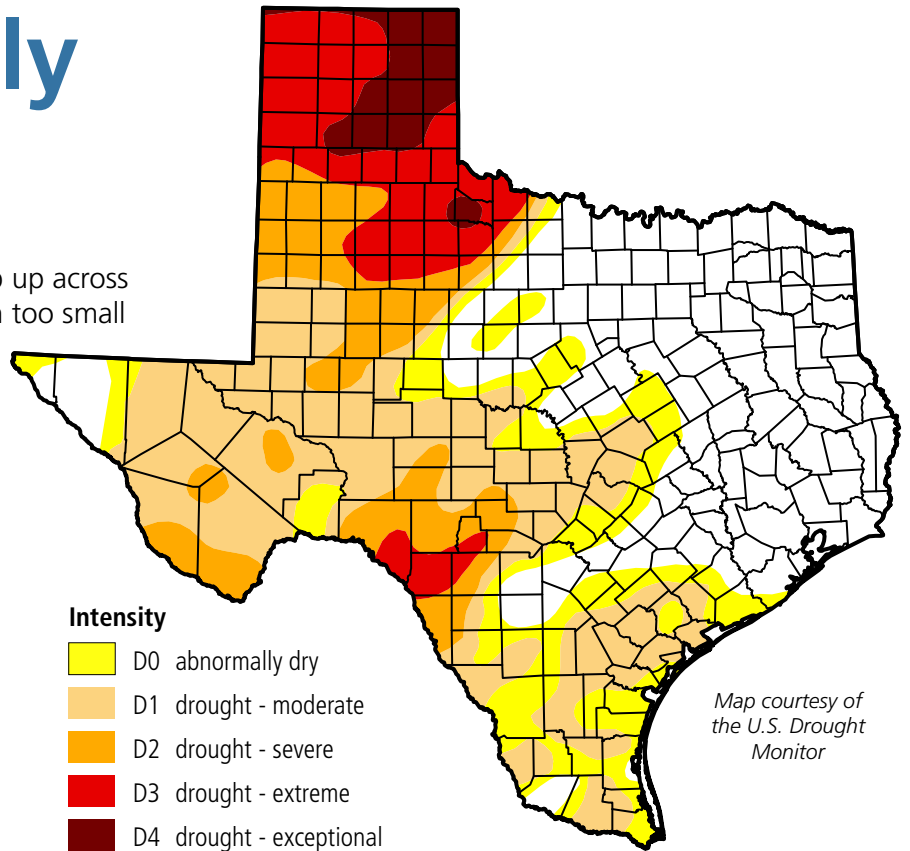

Water conditions

Scattered storms have recently begun to pop up across the state. Rainfall totals, however, have been too small to bring significant relief to areas where it is needed most. The latest map shows an increase of four percentage points in the area of the state impacted by drought.

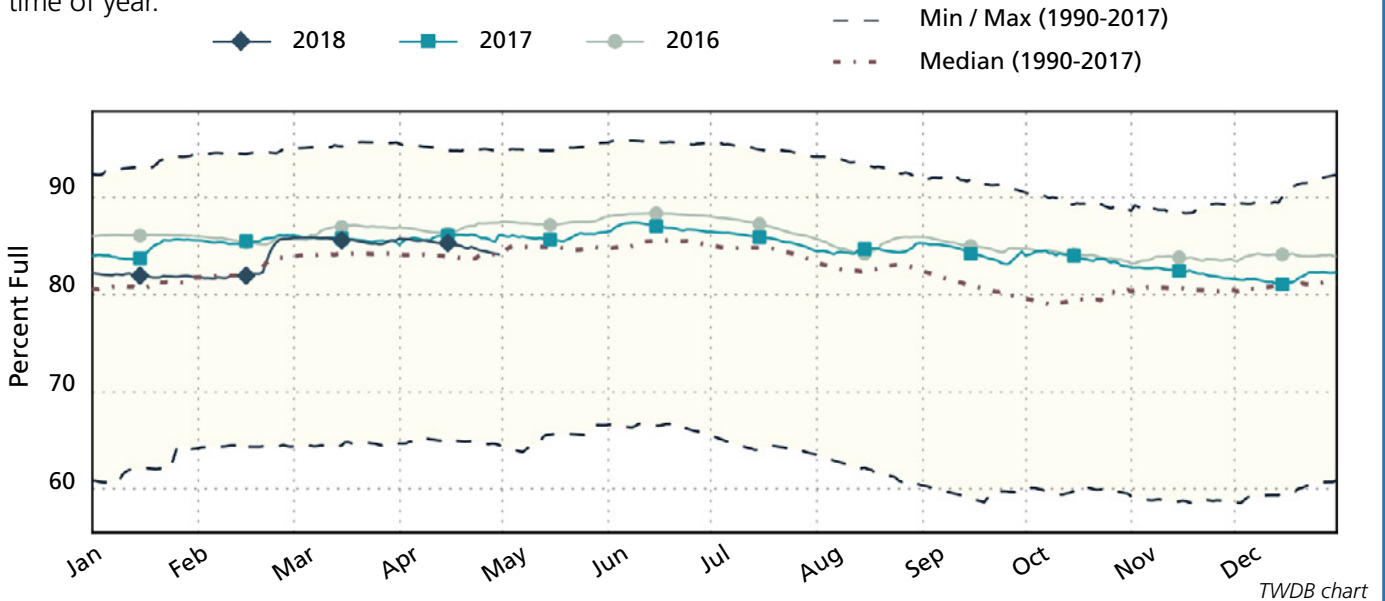
Drought conditions

- ◆ 53% now
- ◆ 49% a week ago
- ◆ 49% three months ago
- ◆ 1% a year ago



Statewide reservoir storage

In the last month, statewide water supply storage has declined about 1.4 percentage points (almost 300,000 acre-feet). Current storage is 26.5 million acre-feet, 84 percent of capacity, and right about normal for this time of year.
