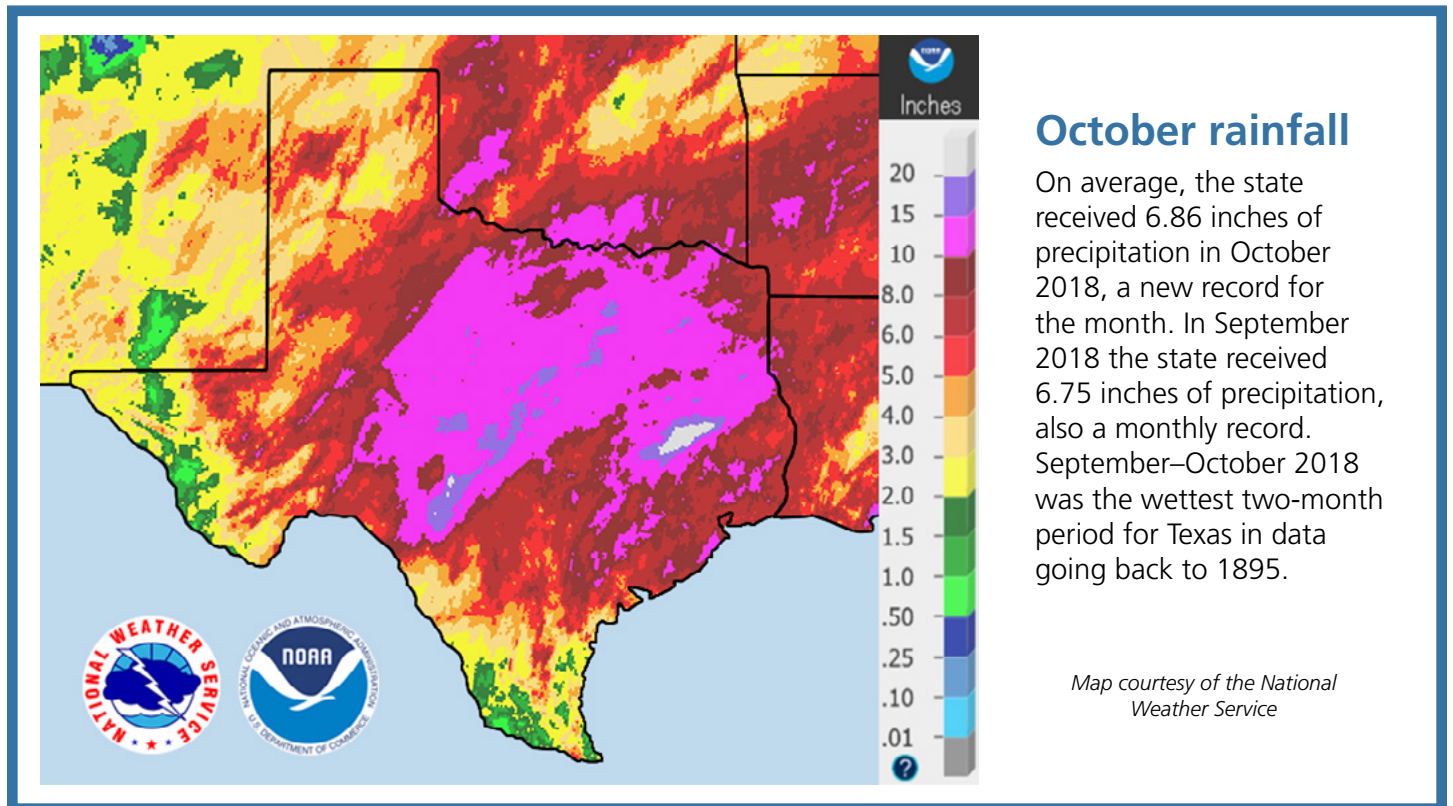
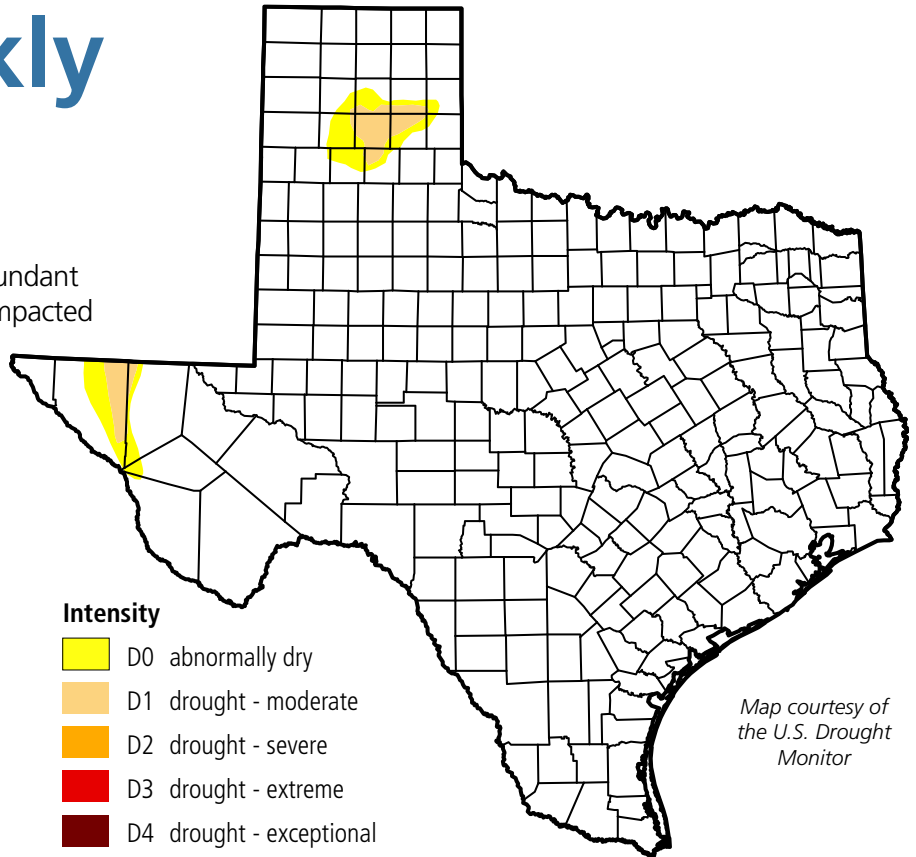

Water conditions

Since the beginning of September 2018, abundant rainfall has decreased the area of the state impacted by drought by 63 percentage points. The latest drought map shows only 1 percent of the state remains impacted by drought.

Drought conditions

- ◆ 1% now
- ◆ 2% a week ago
- ◆ 64% three months ago
- ◆ 9% a year ago



October rainfall

On average, the state received 6.86 inches of precipitation in October 2018, a new record for the month. In September 2018 the state received 6.75 inches of precipitation, also a monthly record. September–October 2018 was the wettest two-month period for Texas in data going back to 1895.
