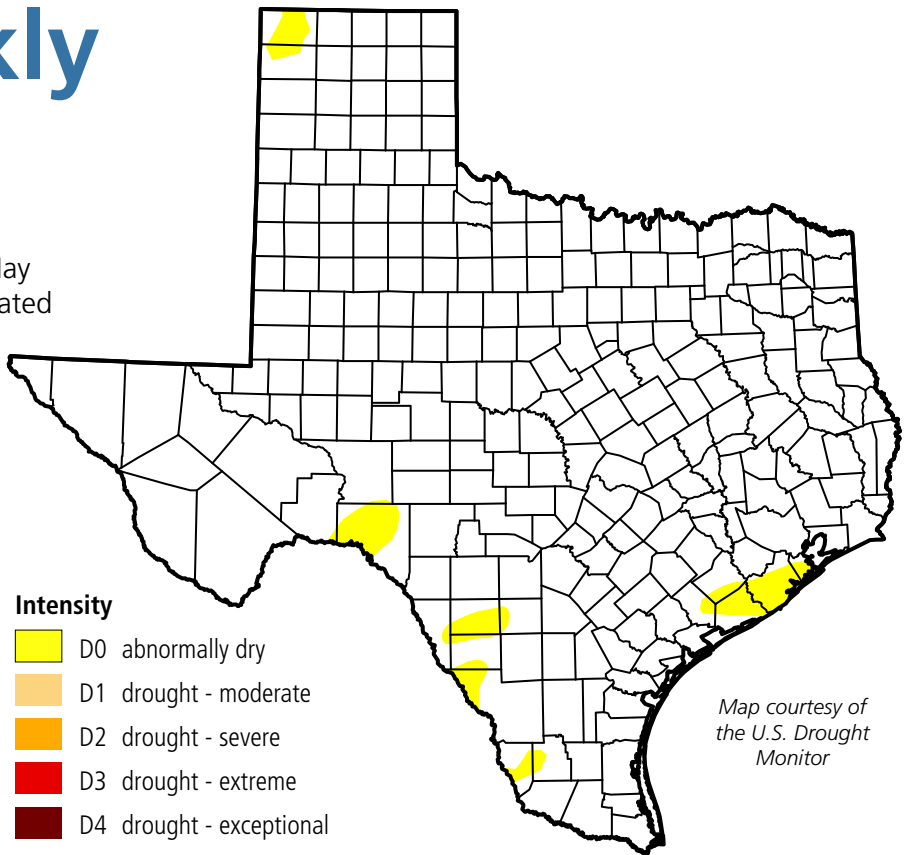

Water conditions

Most of Texas was wet in April and early May 2019. As a result, drought has been eliminated from the state, and the latest drought map shows only scattered pockets of abnormally dry conditions covering about 3 percent of the state.

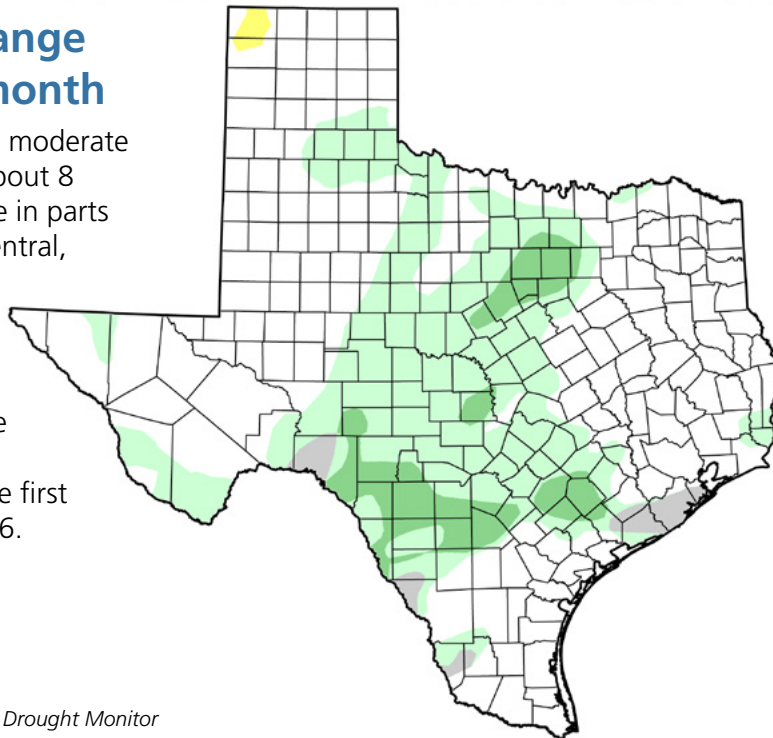
Drought conditions

- ◆ 0% now
- ◆ 1% a week ago
- ◆ 2% three months ago
- ◆ 39% a year ago



Drought change in the last month

In early April 2019, moderate drought covered about 8 percent of the state in parts of north central, central, and south Texas. Since then, above average rainfall has eliminated drought from those areas. Texas is now drought free for the first time since July 2016.
