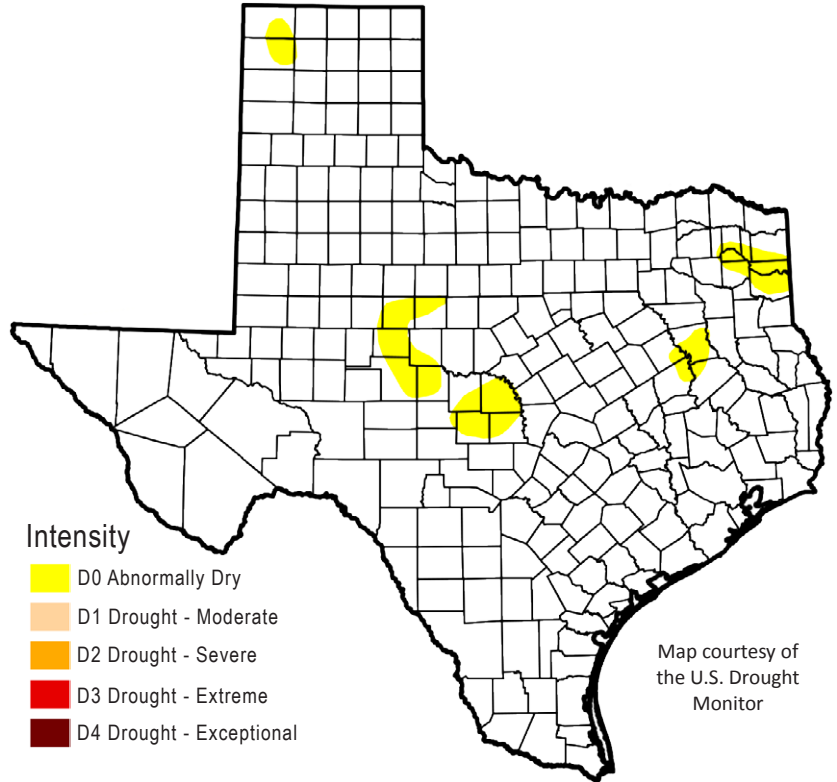


WATER CONDITIONS

Abnormally dry conditions have appeared in parts of northeast Texas, and our 21-week run of statewide reservoir storage increases has ended with statewide storage decreasing by 60,000 acre-feet last week. 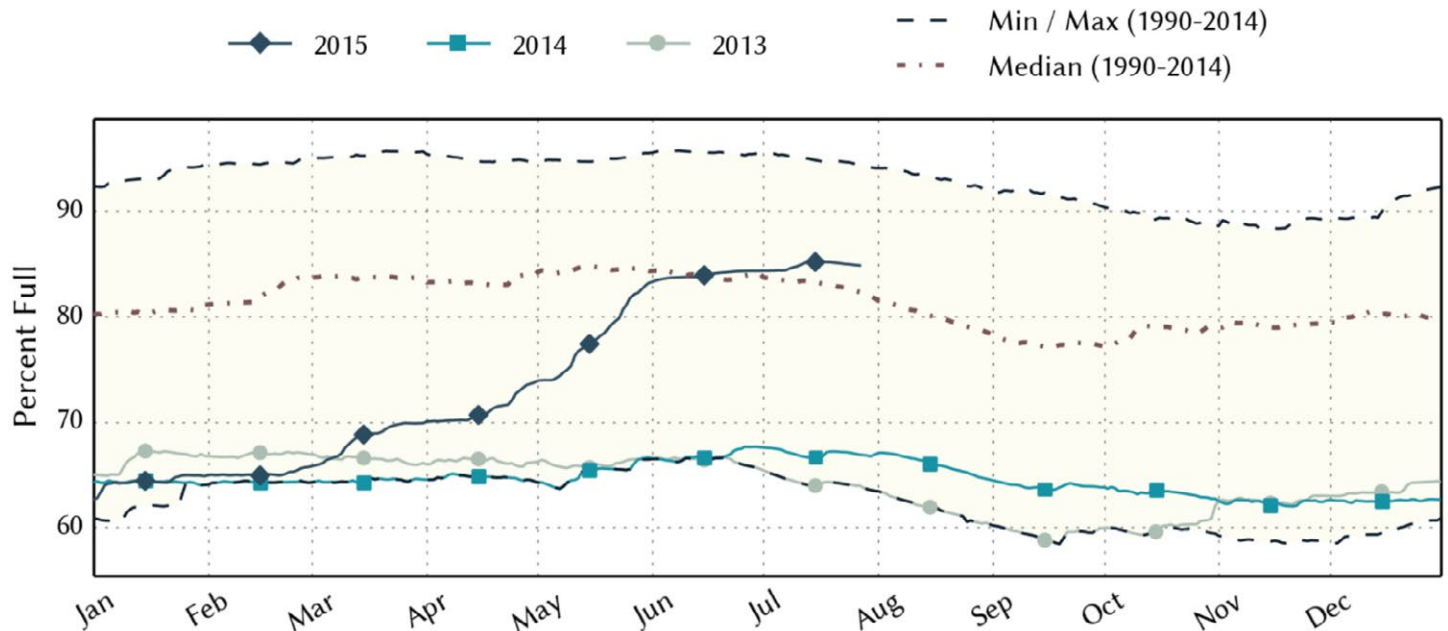
Reservoir storage levels

- 85% now
- 85% a week ago
- 73% three months ago
- 67% a year ago



STATEWIDE RESERVOIR STORAGE

Comparison of statewide reservoir storage minimums, maximums, and medians since 1990 and storage levels for 2013, 2014, and 2015. After receiving large storage bumps in March and May, statewide reservoir storage declined slightly last week.
