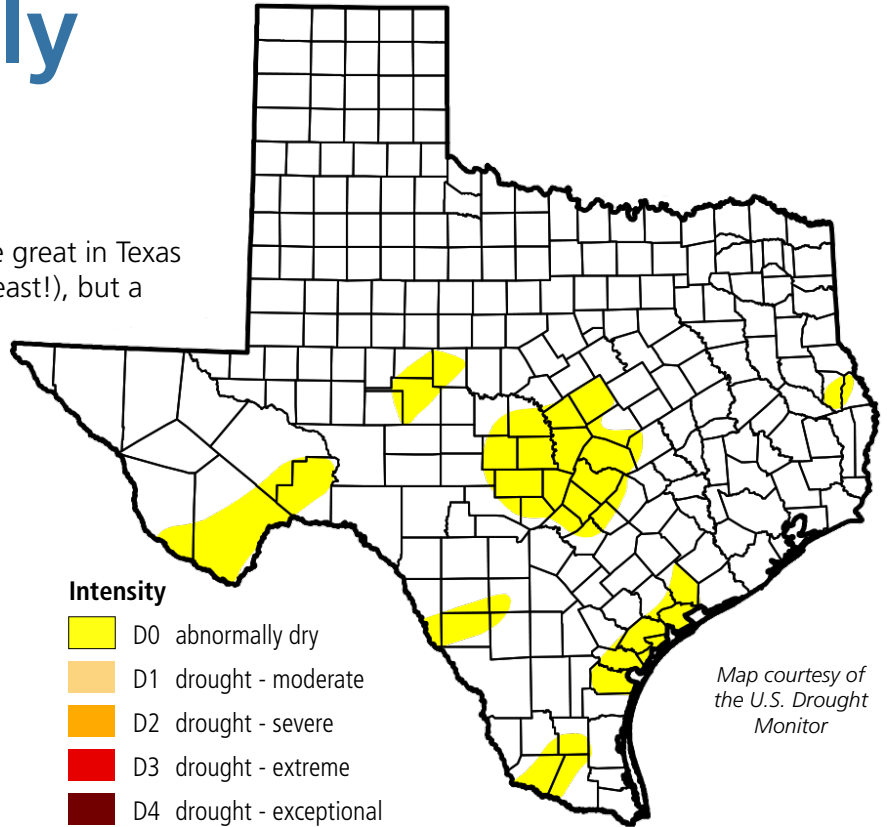

Water conditions

Blue skies and warm weather in February are great in Texas (especially when it's below zero in the northeast!), but a continued lack of rain has greatly increased abnormally dry conditions to 12 percent of the state. We're not quite back into drought yet, but without rainfall, we're trending that way.

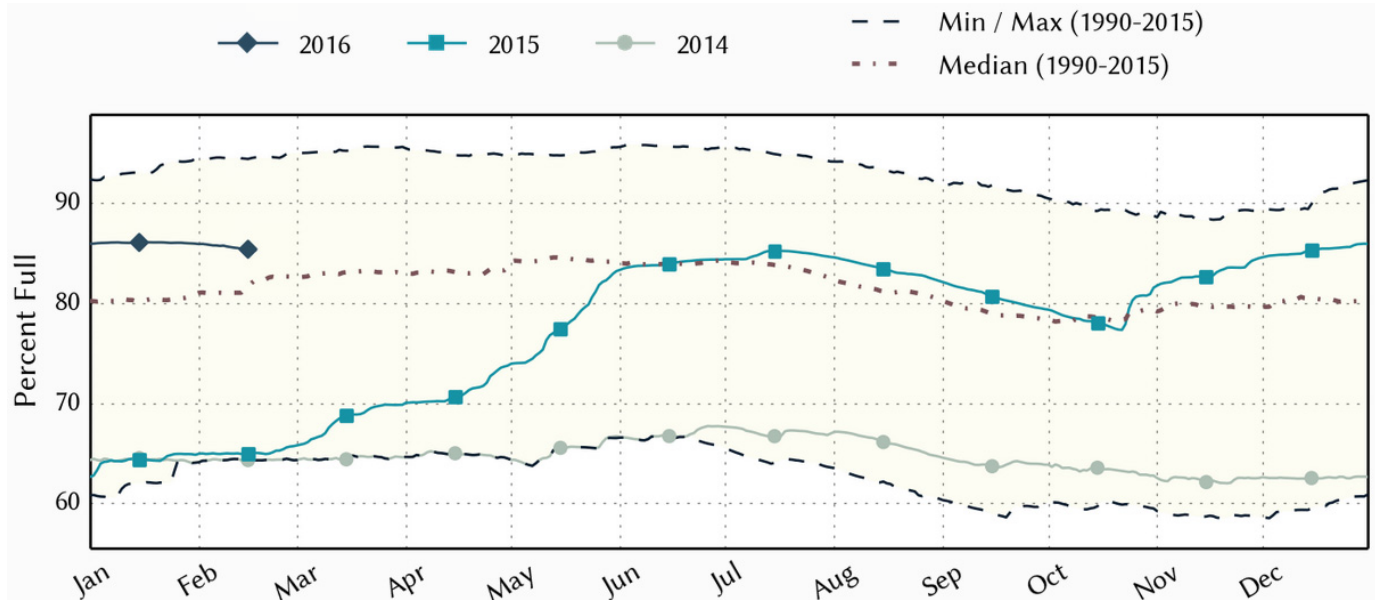
Drought conditions

Statewide reservoir storage

Statewide reservoir storage remains above normal for this time of year, although levels are down slightly (0.8 percentage points) since the recent peak of 86.2 percent full on January 21, 2016.
