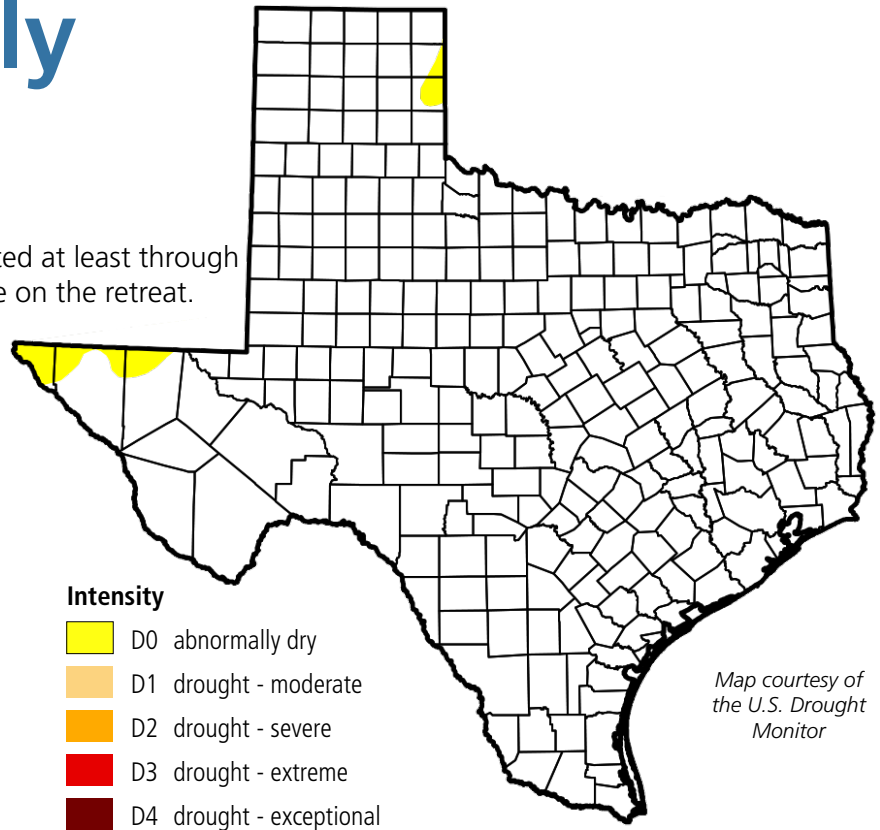
## Water conditions

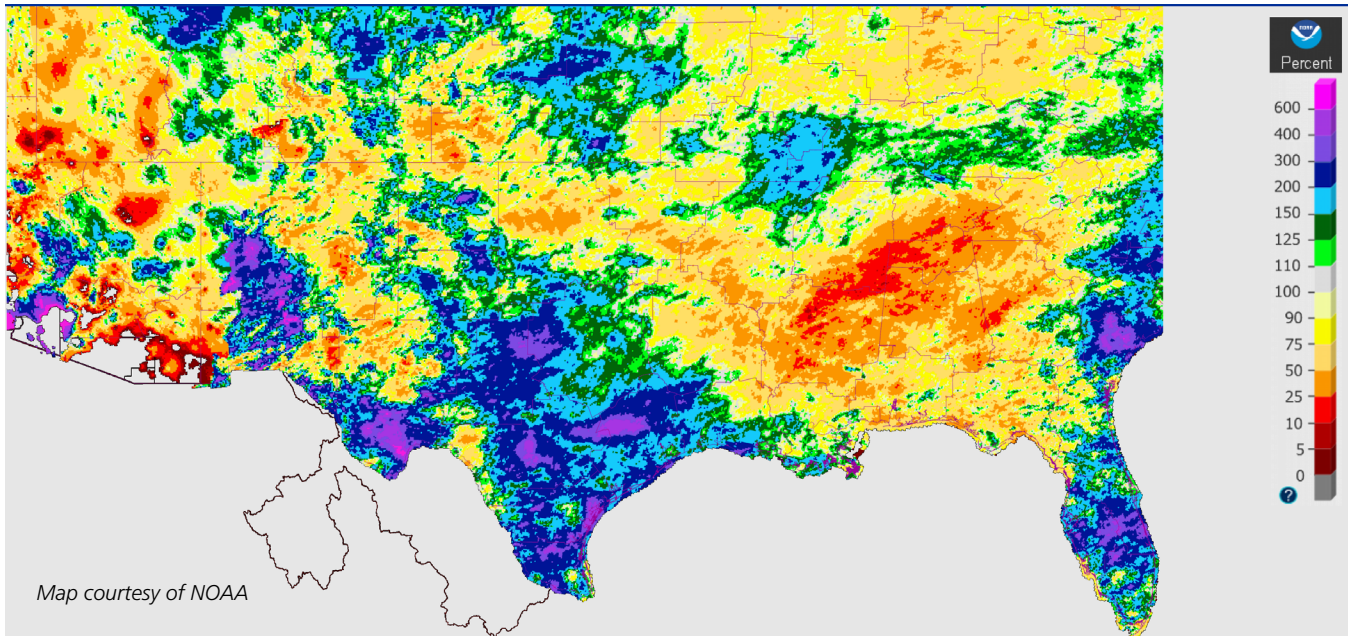
## Drought conditions
