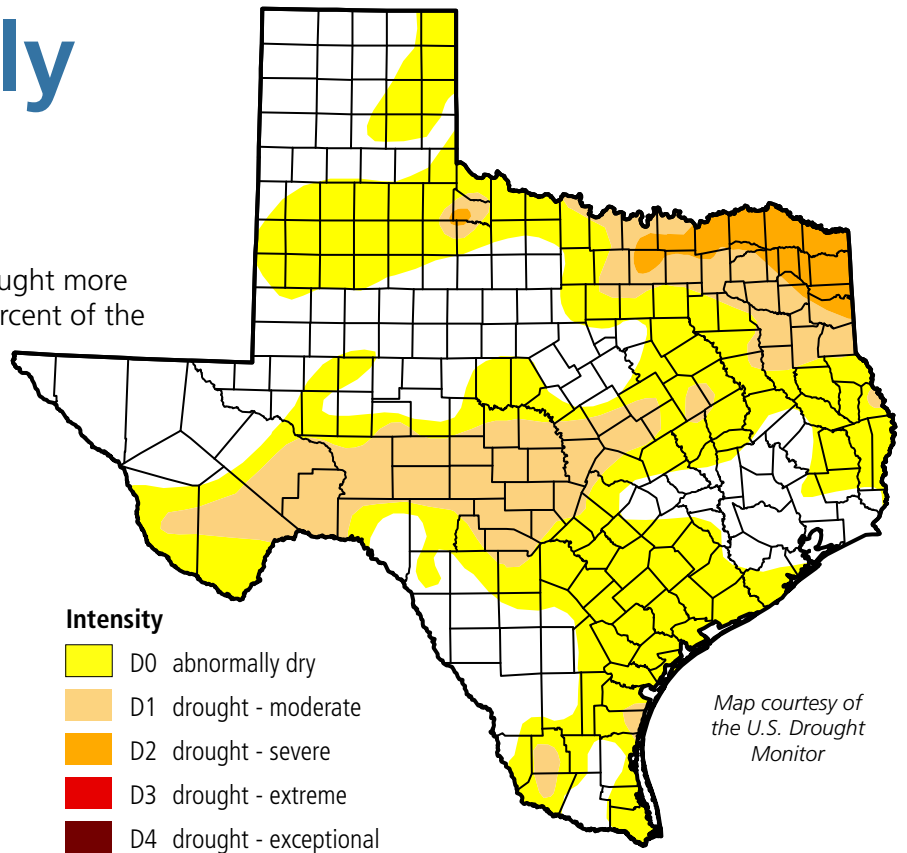

## Water conditions

Another week of dry and warm weather brought more drought to Texas. Drought now covers 20 percent of the state, including 3 percent of the state impacted by severe drought. Forty percent of the state is abnormally dry and in danger of slipping into drought in the next few weeks.

## Drought conditions

- ◆ 20% now
- ◆ 15% a week ago
- ◆ 2% three months ago
- ◆ 15% a year ago



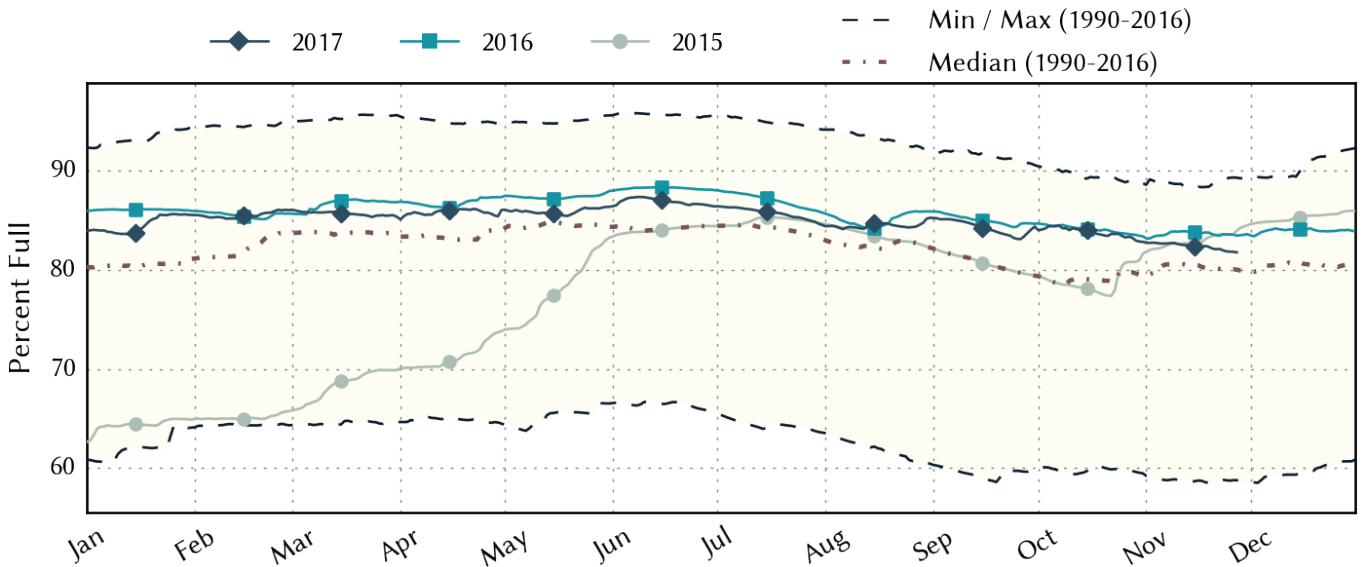

### Intensity

- ◆ D0 abnormally dry
- ◆ D1 drought - moderate
- ◆ D2 drought - severe
- ◆ D3 drought - extreme
- ◆ D4 drought - exceptional

Something to be thankful for this season: As drought strengthens its grip on our state, storage in our water supply reservoirs remains above normal.
