

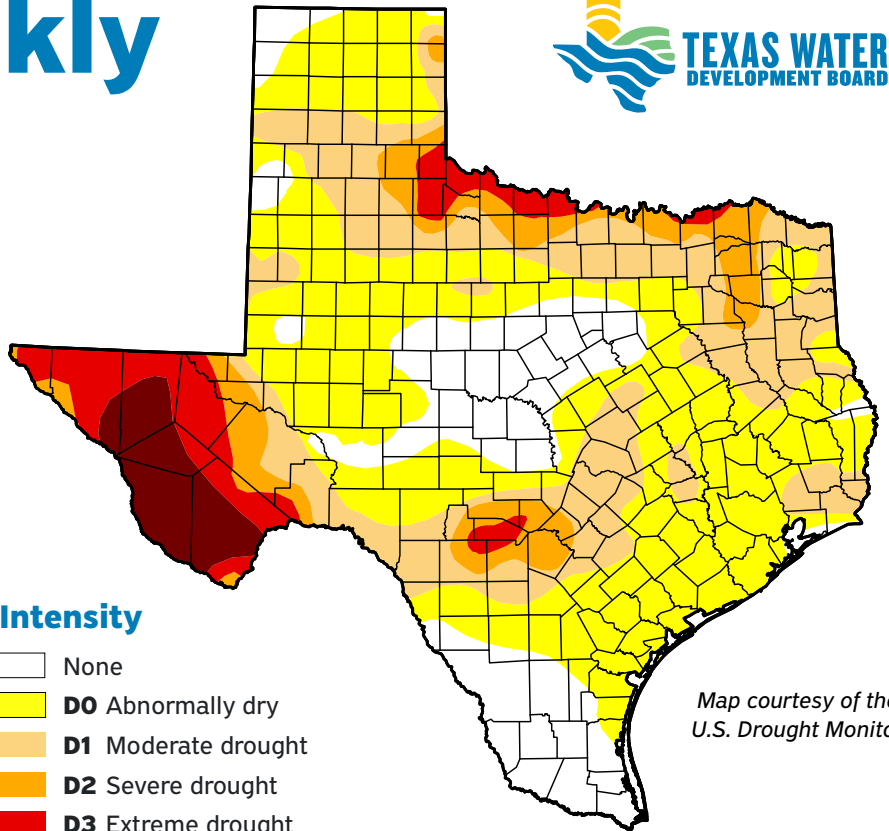

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of October 8 shows expansion of drought in the Panhandle and West, Central, and East Texas. Those expansions were fueled by recent weeks of hotter and drier-than-normal conditions. Additional drought expansion is likely in coming weeks.

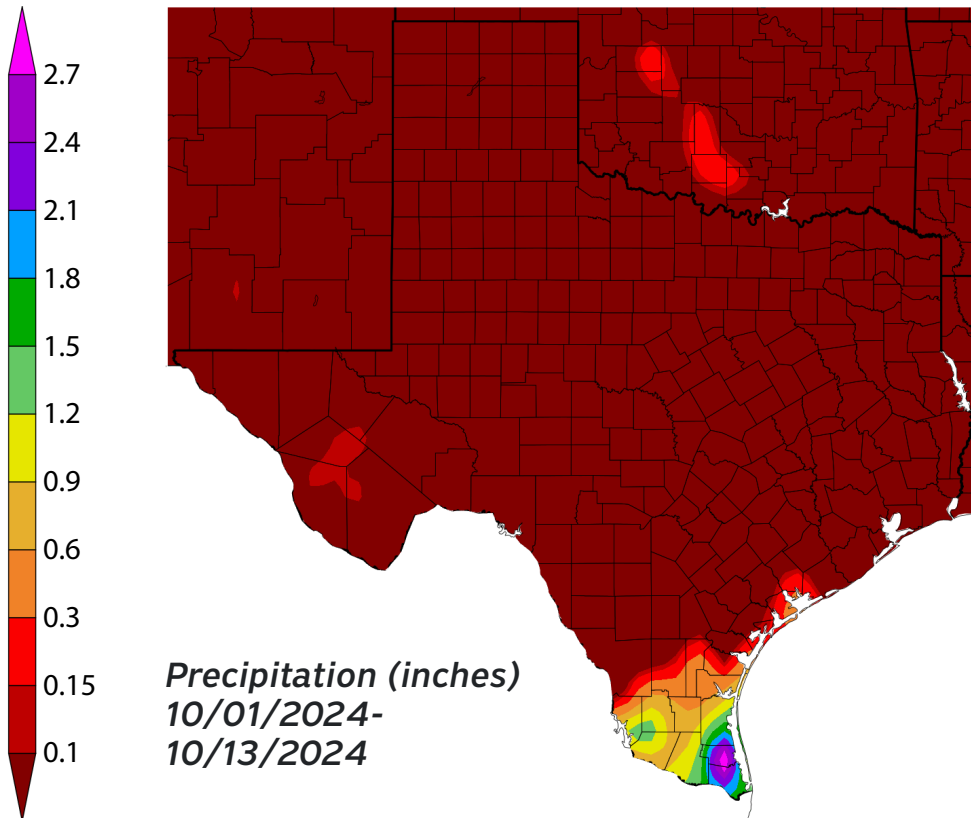

October precipitation

October rainfall has averaged more than 2.5 inches statewide over the last 30 years. This year, rainfall through the middle of the month has been less than one-tenth of an inch for most of the state. Austin, like many locations, hasn't received measurable rainfall since early September.
