



## Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of January 13 shows an increase in drought area, the sixth consecutive week with an increase. Extreme or worse drought now impacts almost 15 percent of the state, its largest extent in half a year. Expect more drought on next week's map.



## U.S. seasonal drought outlook

It looks like drought conditions will get worse before they get better. The latest seasonal drought outlook anticipates continued drought expansion across Texas through the end of April. Only a pocket of north-central and eastern Texas is expected to remain drought free, along with the northeast corner of the Panhandle.
