


# Water Weekly

## Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of March 4 shows the largest extent of drought in our state since November 2024. Drought intensified in West, Central, and South Texas—and for the second consecutive week, drought expanded in the Panhandle. Further drought expansion on next week's map seems likely.



## U.S. seasonal drought outlook

The National Weather Service has revised their seasonal drought outlook for conditions through the end of May. The revision is pessimistic for Texas and anticipates drought expansion across most of the state during that time. Only the northeast corner of the state is expected to remain drought free.
