

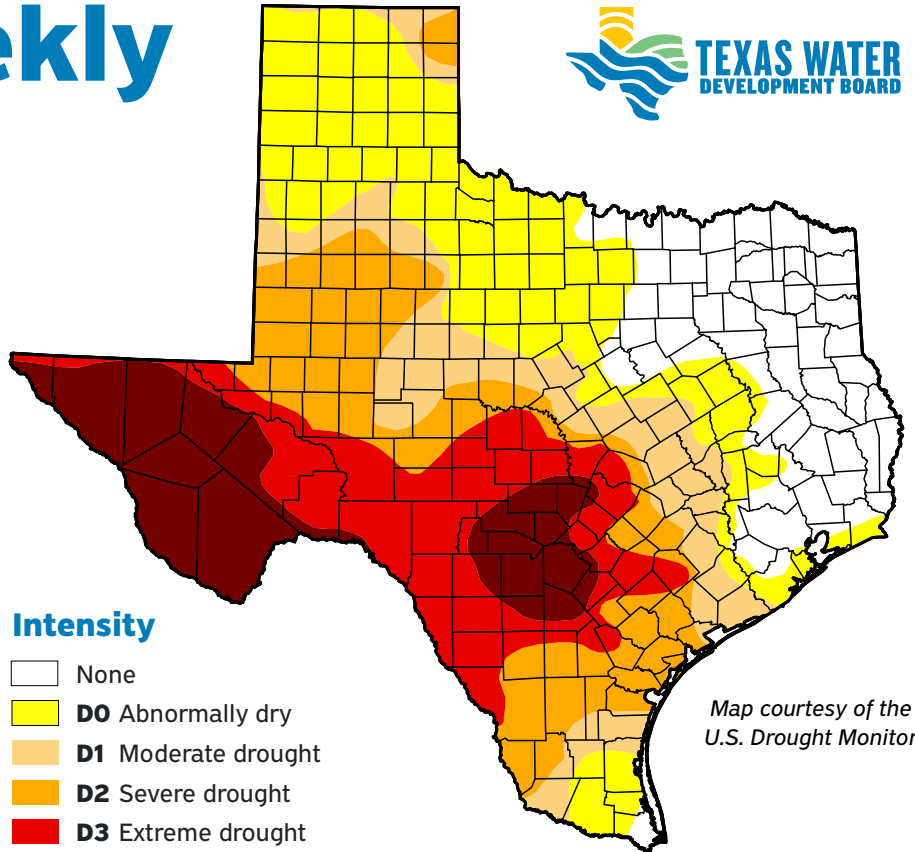

Water conditions

This week's drought map, for conditions as of April 8, shows one category of improvement across large areas of north Texas. This is the first time since November 2024 that drought has contracted in consecutive weeks—drought area has declined to its smallest area in four weeks.

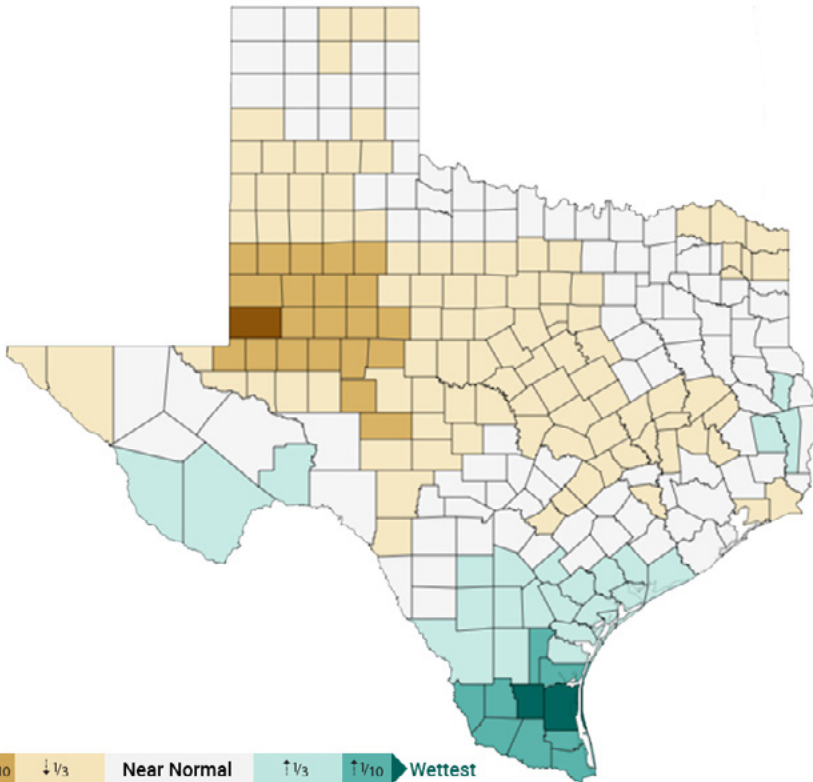

March 2025 precipitation rank

Rainfall averaged 1.37 inches across the state last month. But Andrews County in West Texas tied its record for driest March in 131 years with no measurable precipitation. Meanwhile, Brooks and Kenedy counties in South Texas set new records for wettest March, each with more than 4.5 inches of rain.
