

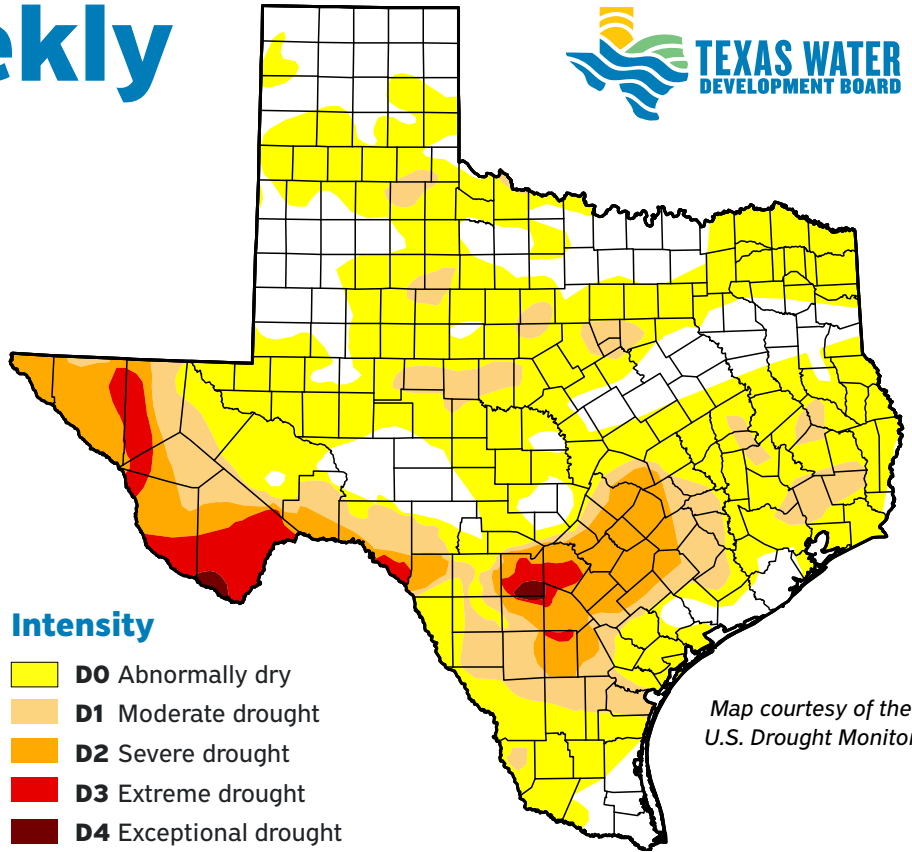

## Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of October 7 shows an increase in drought for the fourth consecutive week. In the last week, drought expanded in East and north central Texas. With almost 50 percent of the state currently classified as abnormally dry, expect more drought in coming weeks.

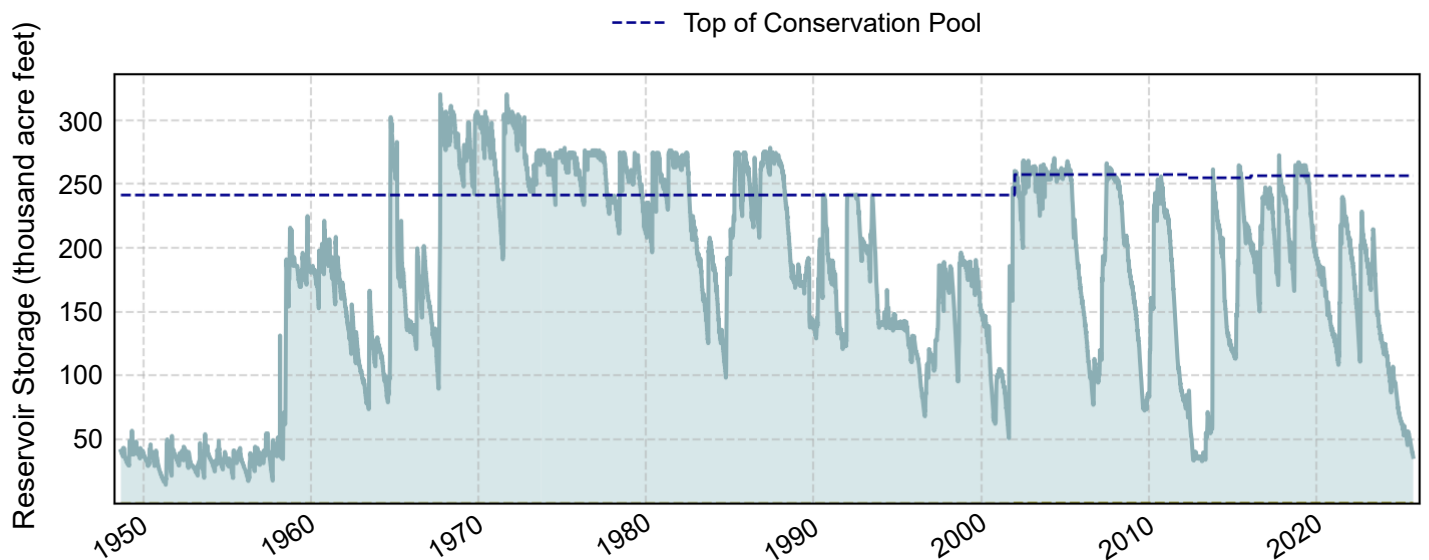

## Lake Corpus Christi storage

Lake Corpus Christi, an important water supply for South Texas, was last full in 2019. In the last week, the lake's water supply volume shrank to less than 37,000 acre-feet and is approaching its smallest volume in more than 50 years (32,855 acre-feet on March 9, 2013).
