The latest drought map for conditions as of November 18 shows an increase in drought area from the previous week, the ninth weekly increase in the past 10 weeks. Drought area has reached its largest extent since early April, but recent rainfall should bring improvements to next week's map.

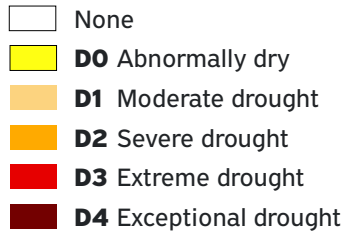

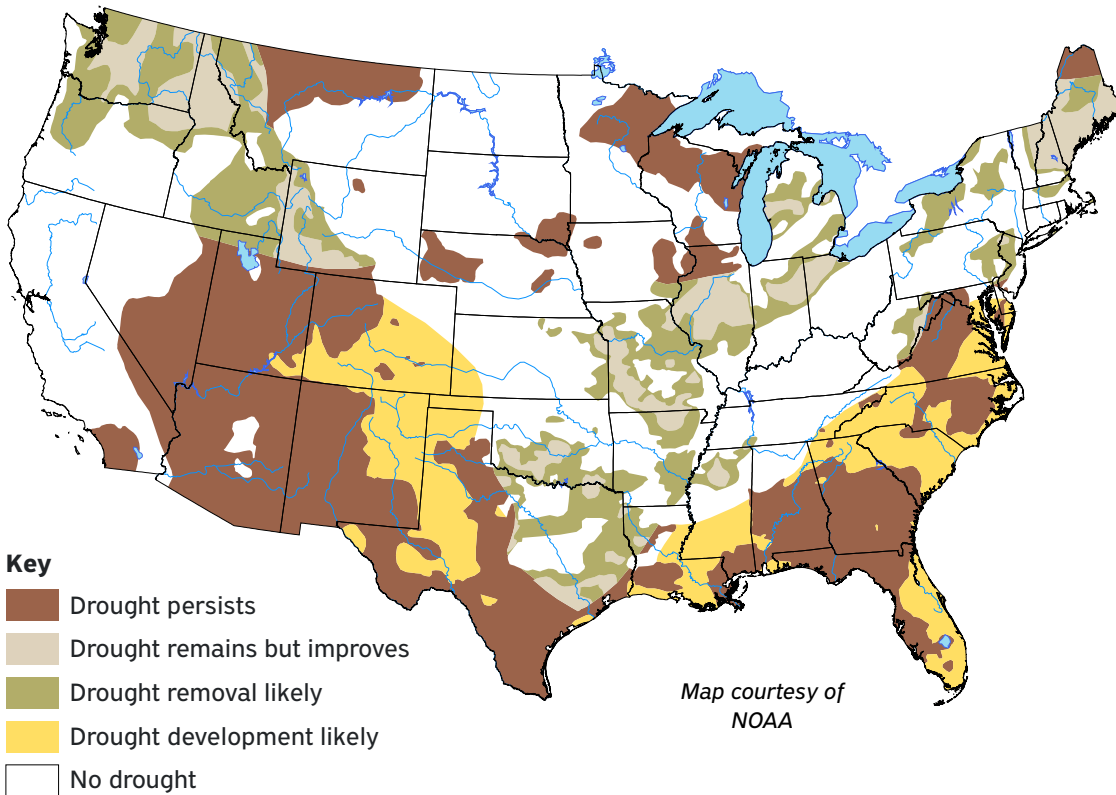
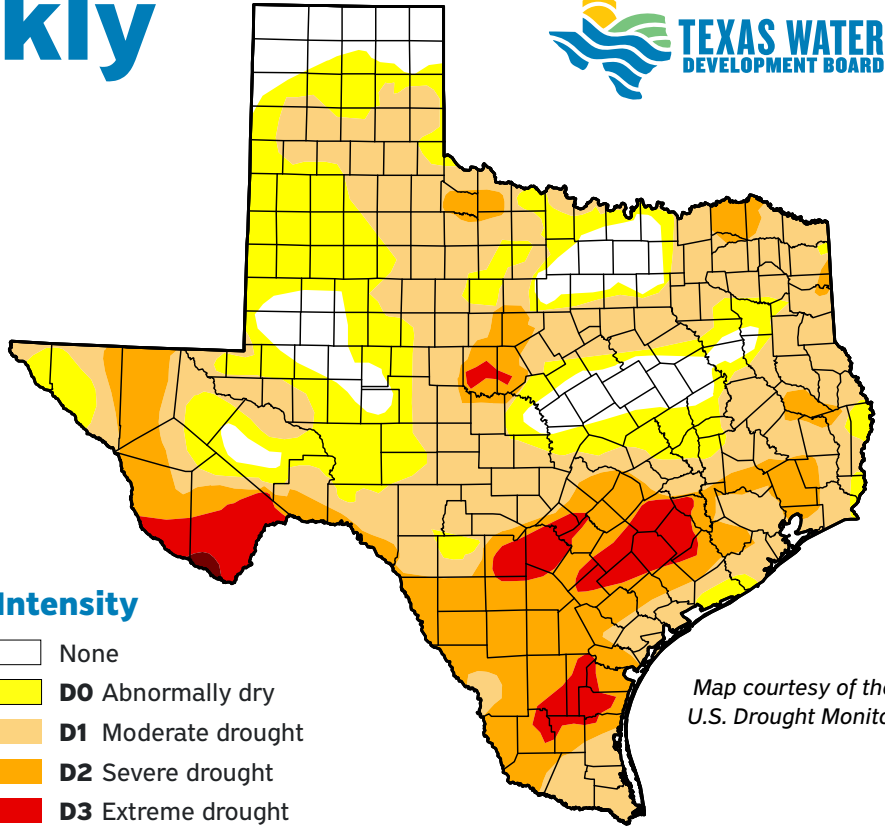

U.S. seasonal drought outlook

The latest seasonal drought outlook for conditions through the end of February 2026 has good news and bads news for Texas. Drought is expected to contract in north central and East Texas but expand in the Panhandle and remain entrenched in Central, South, and West Texas.

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
