

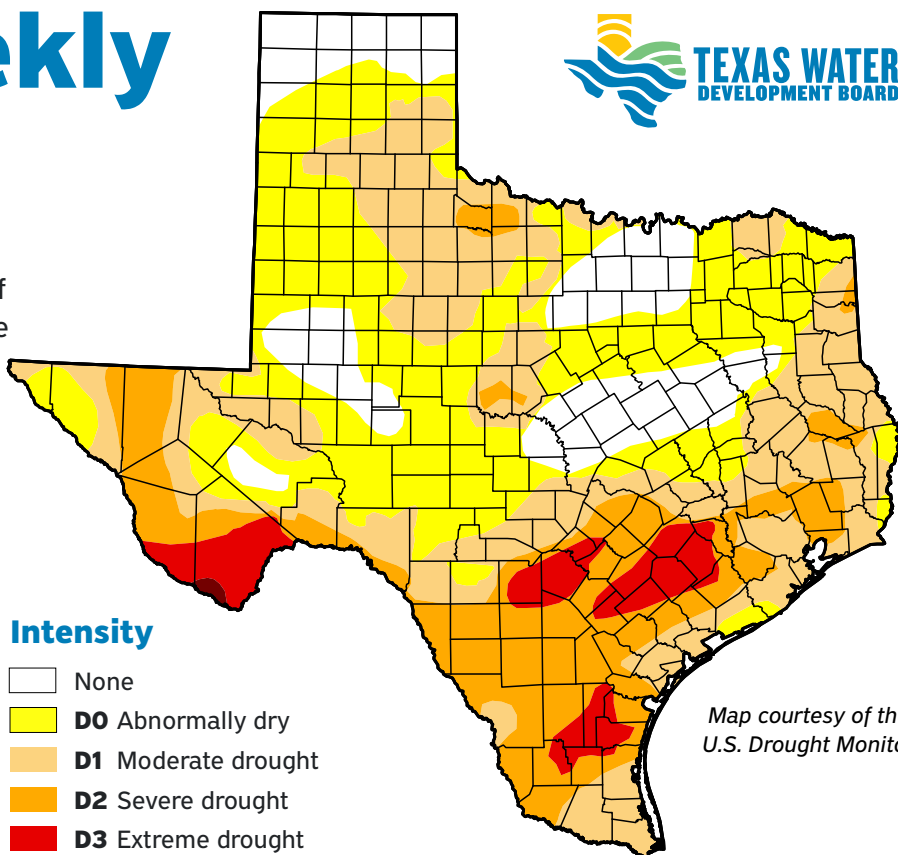
# Water Weekly

## Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of November 25 shows a significant decrease in drought area from the previous week, the first weekly decrease in the past four weeks. In the last week, a large area from Central Texas to the northeast saw one category of improvement.

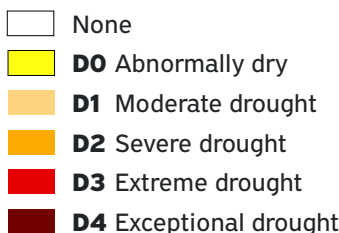

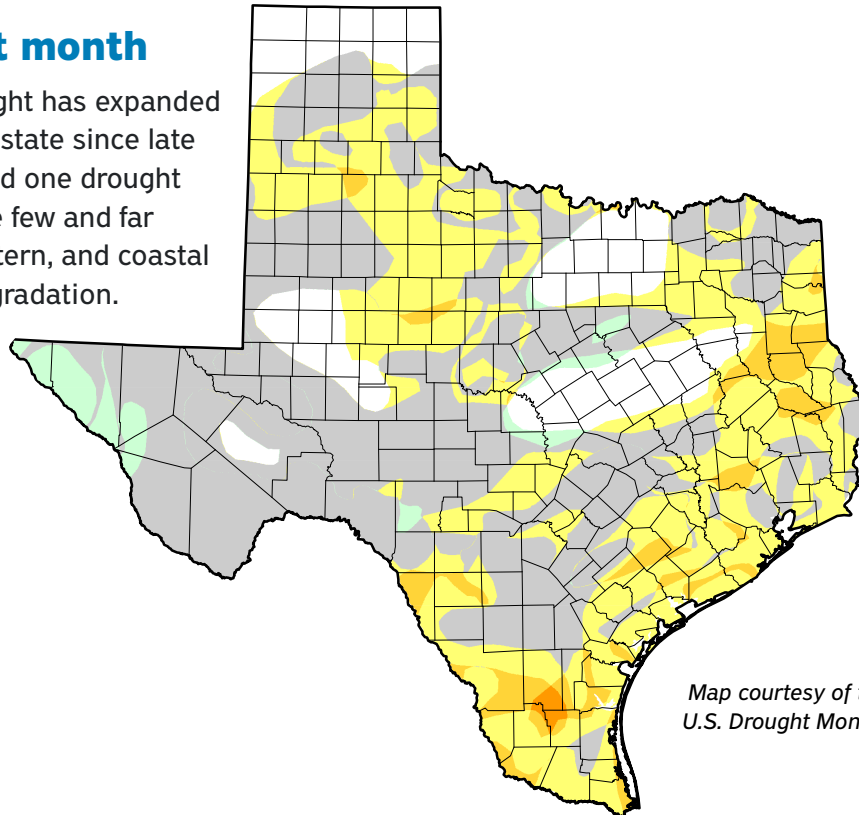
### Intensity



## Drought change in the last month

Despite last week's improvements, drought has expanded to cover an additional 20 percent of the state since late October. Parts of far west Texas improved one drought category, but overall improvements were few and far between. Several areas of southern, eastern, and coastal Texas experienced two categories of degradation.
