

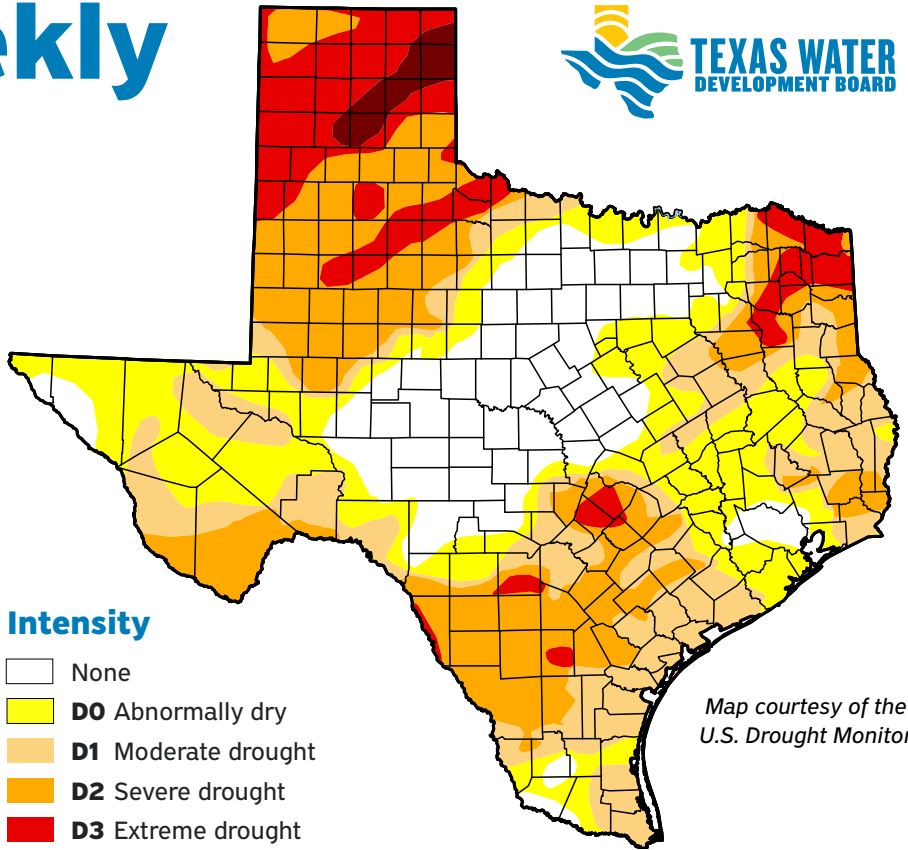
# Water Weekly

## Water conditions

After no change in total drought area last week, the latest map for conditions as of May 26 shows a return to the pattern of weekly drought contraction. Since last week, widespread areas of East and South Texas experienced one category of improvement. In the Panhandle, there was a mix of improvement and degradation.

**57%** now

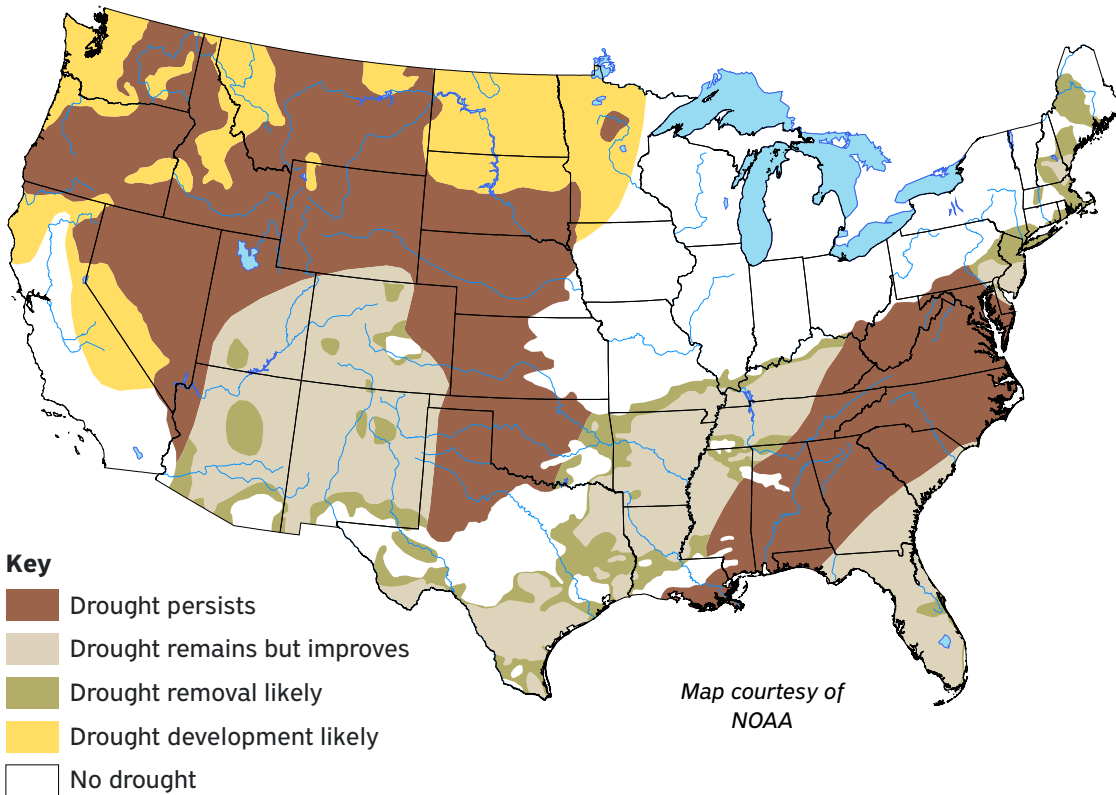
**65%** a week ago

## U.S. seasonal drought outlook

Apart from the Panhandle, the latest seasonal outlook for conditions through the end of August anticipates additional drought contraction and improvements across Texas. The expected return of El Niño conditions could bring even more drought relief to Texas during the fall and winter.

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
