

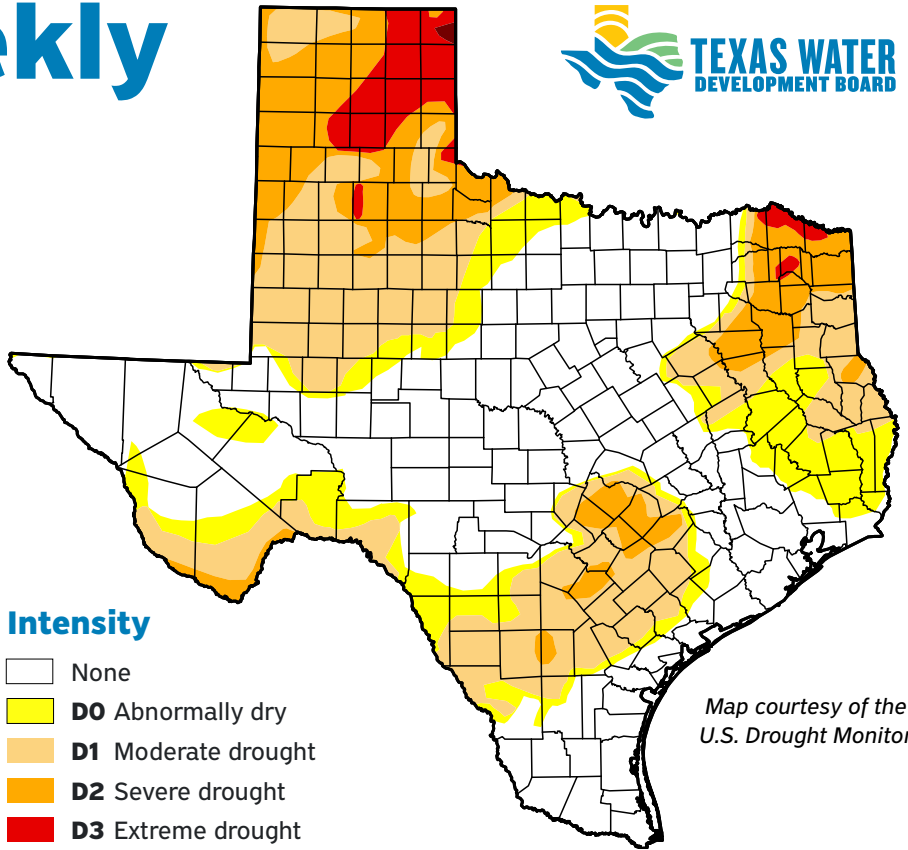

The latest drought map for conditions as of June 16 shows drought contraction for the tenth week in the last eleven weeks. Total drought area in the state has reached a new low for 2026, and we can expect more improvement on next week's map with recent rains.

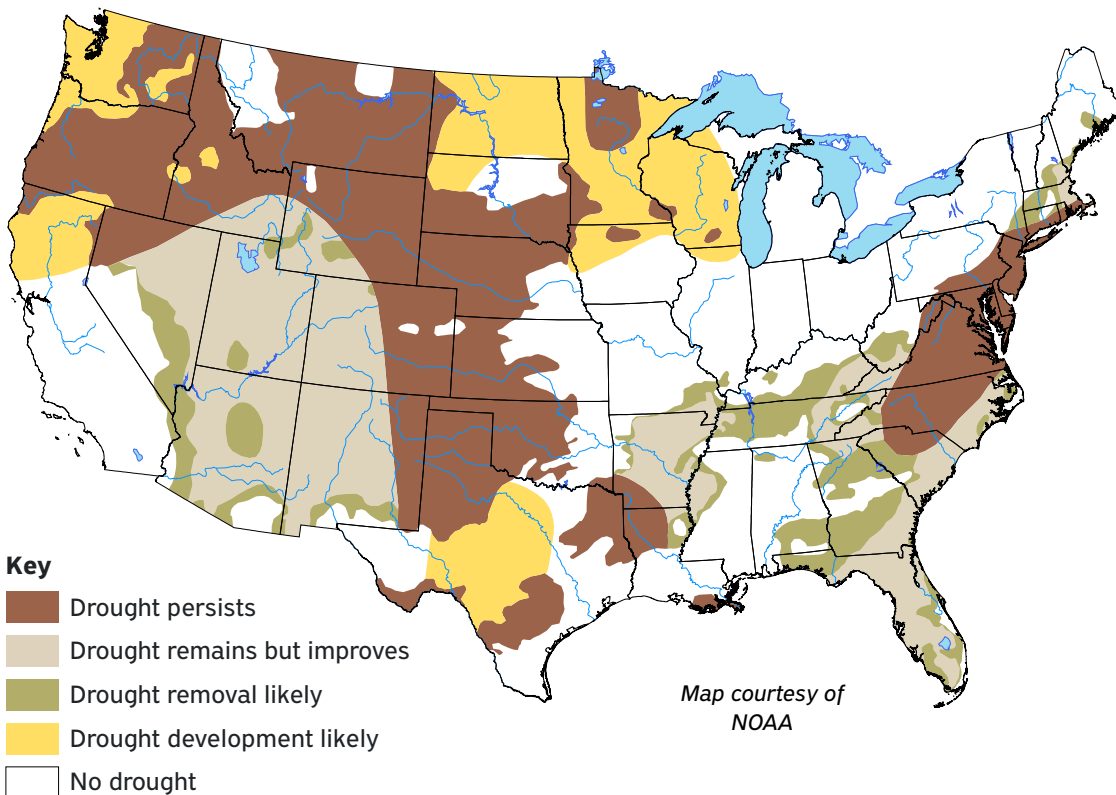

U.S. seasonal drought outlook

Summers in Texas are generally hot and dry, which is not a good recipe for drought improvements. The latest seasonal drought outlook from the National Weather Service echoes that theme. Through September, they expect Texas' drought improvements to halt while drought expands across the central portion of the state.
