Water conditions

In the last week, degradations outpaced improvements across the state, leading to the second consecutive week that drought has expanded. After a five-week absence, exceptional drought (the most severe category) has returned to the state in parts of Carson and Gray counties in the Panhandle.

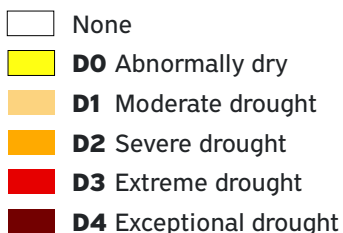

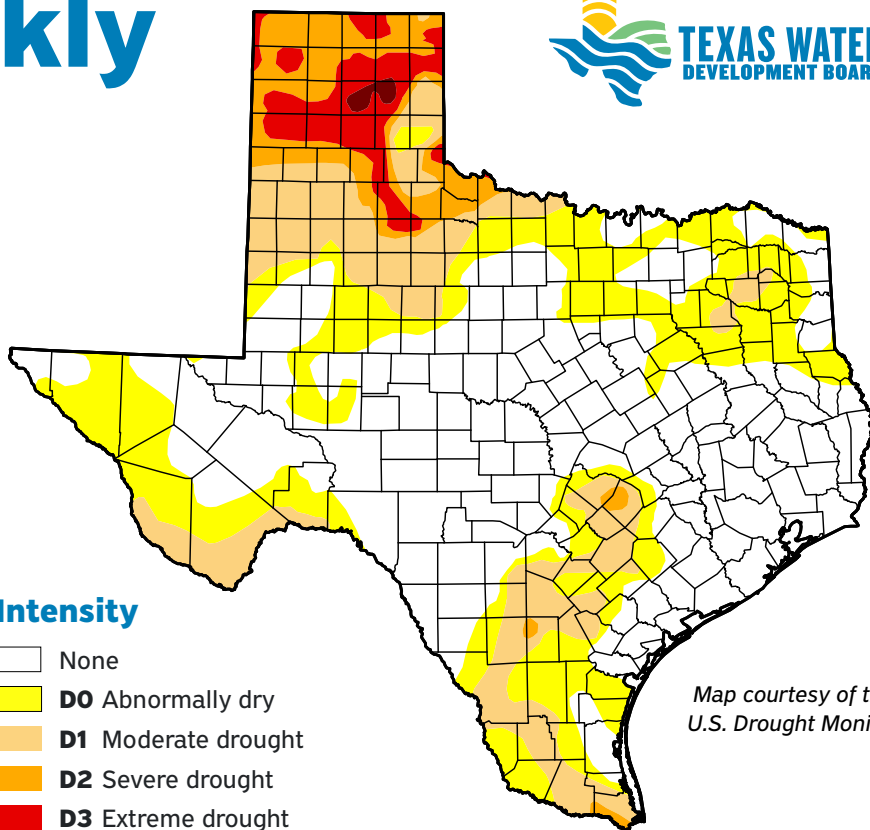

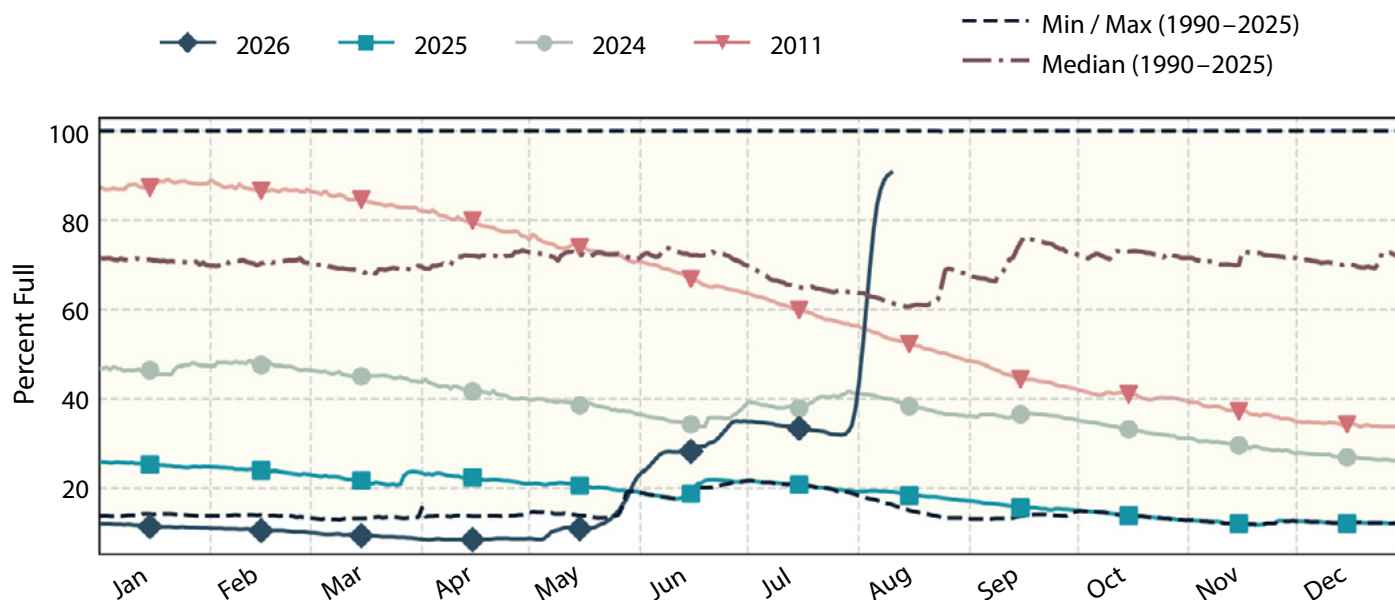

Lake Corpus Christi storage

In mid-July, flooding on the Nueces River impacted communities in Uvalde County. In the last week, those same floodwaters made their way to Lake Corpus Christi, boosting lake volume from less than a third of capacity on July 29 to more than 90 percent of capacity on August 9.



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
