DROUGHT CONDITIONS


Reservoir storage is the lowest we have seen since 1990 for this time of year. Aquifer levels continue to fall in most of the state with drought restrictions impacting pumping in some aquifers, notably the Edwards Aquifer.

Drought statistics

- 97% of state currently in drought
- 99% a week ago
- 99% three months ago
- 88% a year ago

Reservoir statistics (statewide)

- · Currently 63% full
- 64% a week ago
- 66% three months ago
- 72% a year ago
- Normally 83% at this time




RESERVOIR CONDITIONS

There are haves and have-nots for water in reservoirs with the majority of the reservoirs in West and South Texas less than 30 percent full.

Key reservoirs (percent full)

- Amistad (Lower Rio Grande Valley area): 41%
- Choke Canyon (Corpus Christi area): 38%
- Elephant Butte (El Paso area): 4%
- Lavon (Dallas area): 60%
- Livingston (Houston area): 96%
- Meredith (Amarillo-Lubbock area): 0%
- O.H. Ivie (San Angelo-Midland-Odessa area): 18%
- Travis (Austin area): 33%
