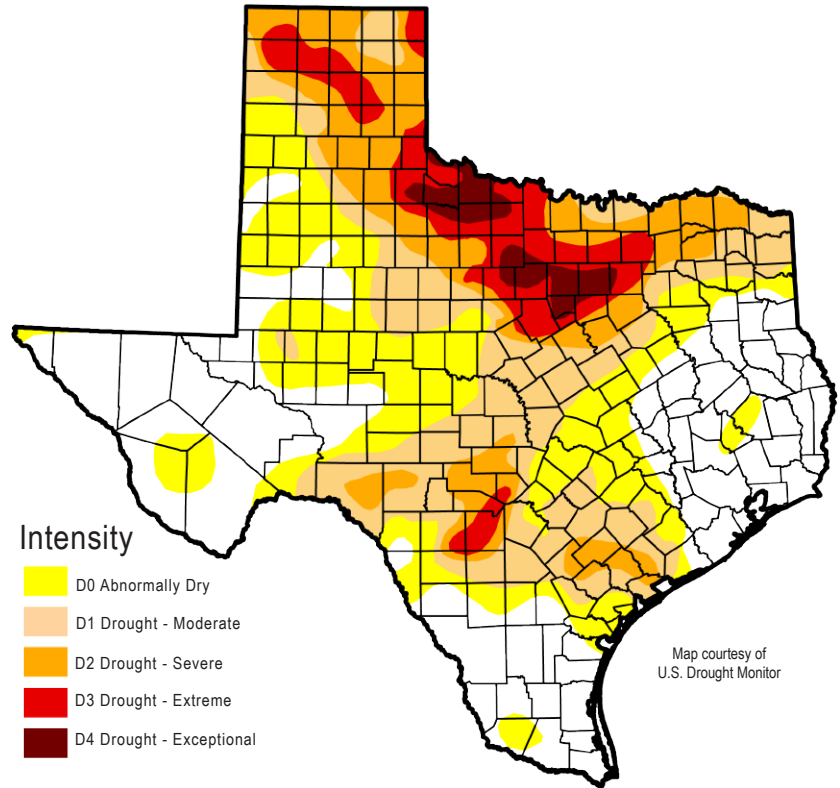


## DROUGHT CONDITIONS

Similar to last week, drought conditions and statewide reservoir levels remain essentially unchanged. Generally, statewide reservoir levels remain flat October through December and rise January through March. 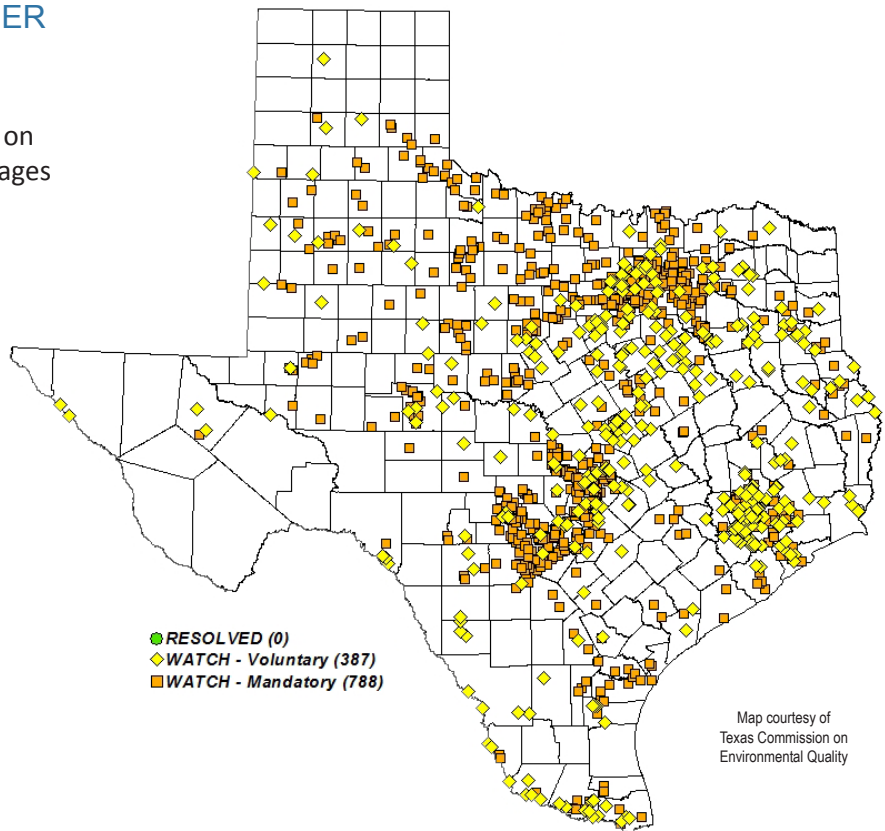
### Drought statistics

- 43% of state currently in moderate to exceptional drought
- 43% a week ago
- 58% three months ago
- 45% a year ago
