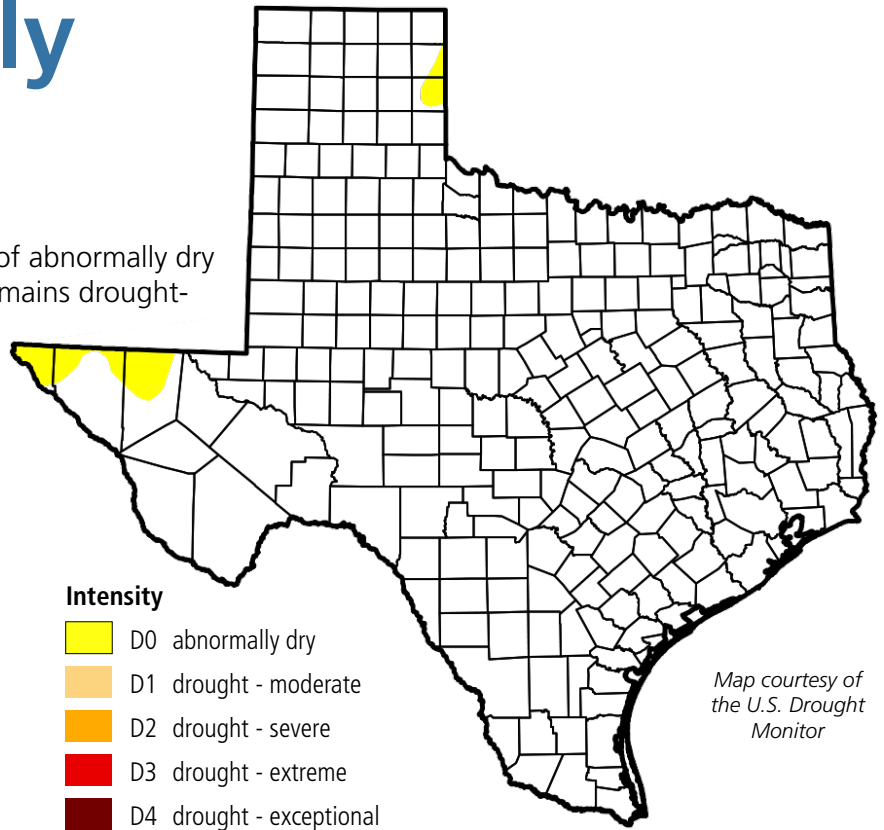

## Water conditions

Over the past week there was an expansion of abnormally dry conditions in Culberson County, but Texas remains drought-free. Reservoir conditions are still low in parts of West and Far West Texas, but recent rains have helpfully lifted reservoir levels in O.H. Ivie from 12 to 24 percent full.

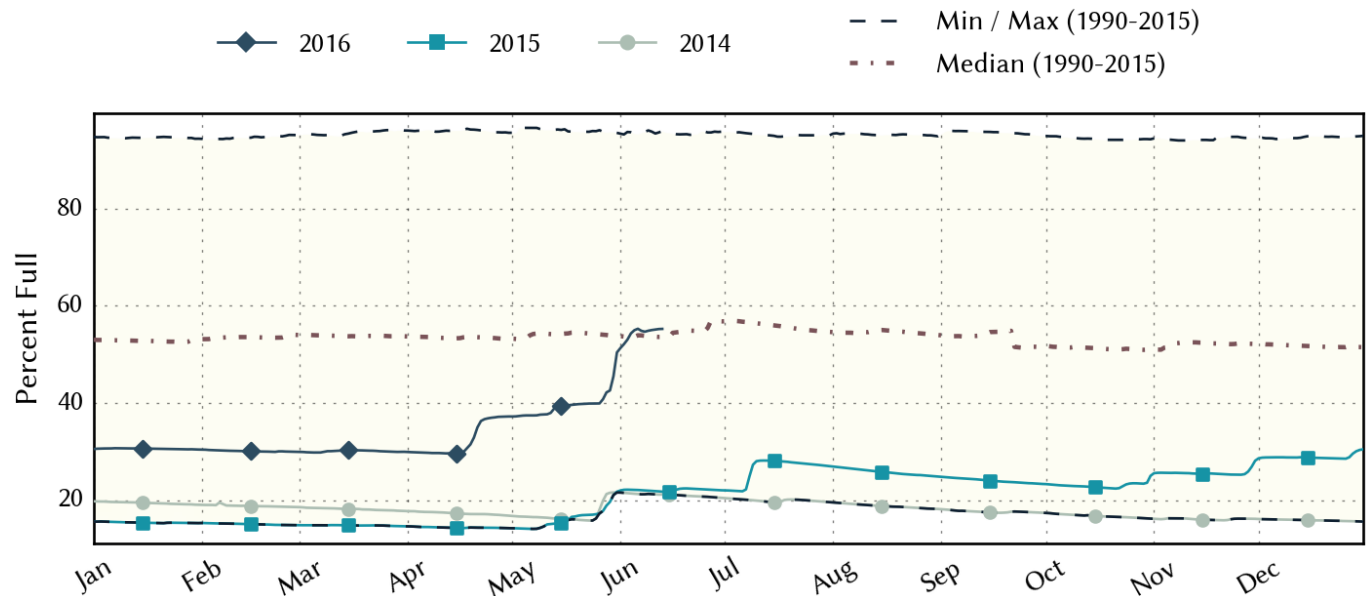
## Drought conditions

## Abilene area reservoir storage

For the first time since their water supply drought started, Abilene's reservoirs are above their median level due to rises in Hubbard Creek and O.H. Ivie reservoirs.
