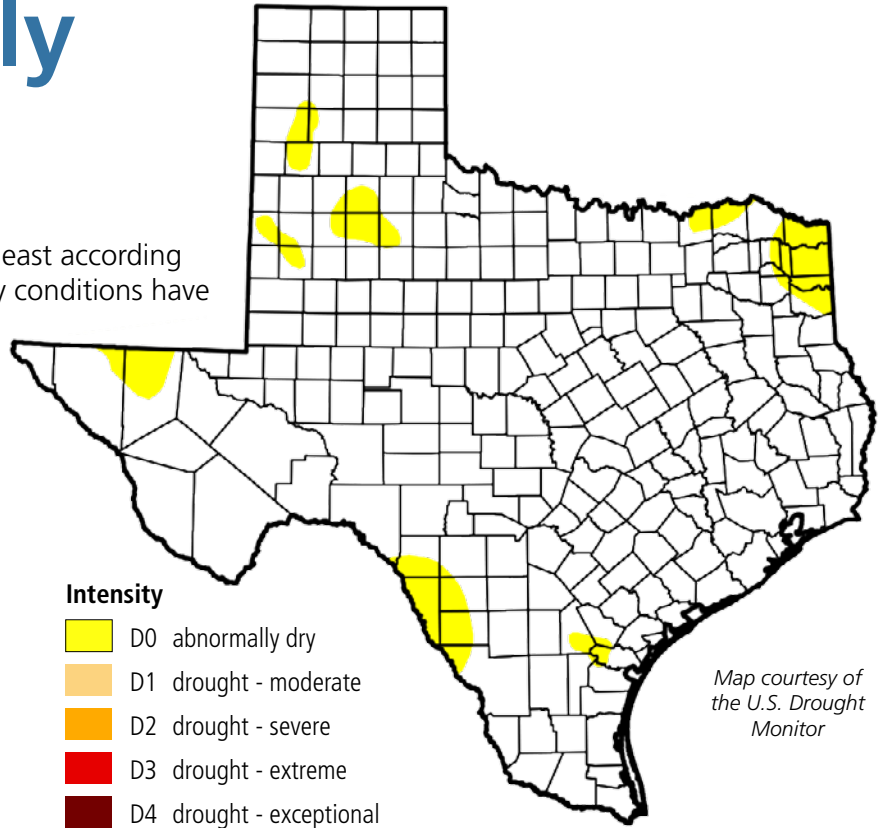

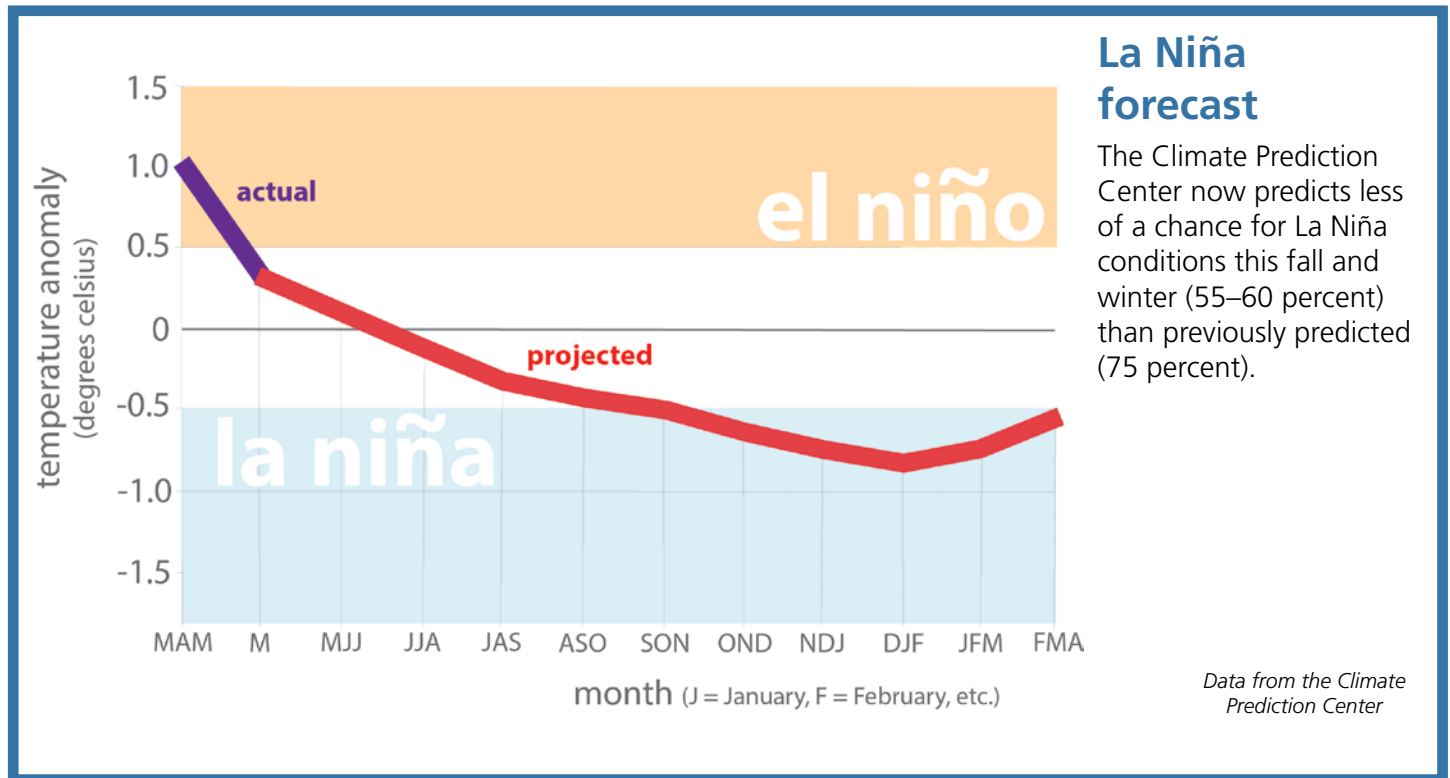
Water conditions

Although the state remains drought free (at least according to the U.S. Drought Monitor), abnormally dry conditions have doubled with new dry spots sprouting up in the Lubbock area, in the Corpus Christi area, and in the northeast. The El Paso area saw improvement with the removal of abnormally dry conditions.

La Niña forecast

The Climate Prediction Center now predicts less of a chance for La Niña conditions this fall and winter (55–60 percent) than previously predicted (75 percent).
