
The latest drought map, for conditions as of September 4, shows some improvement, especially in central and coastal Texas. Other areas, mostly farther west, experienced a worsening of conditions. Scattered rainfall across the state is expected to continue and should bring

more improvements to the next map.


Drought conditions

Elephant Butte Reservoir storage hydrograph Elephant Butte Reservoir, a water supply for El Paso, began the year more than 20 percent full but is now down to 4 percent of capacity, its lowest volume in September since 1978. During July 2013, the reservoir's volume shrank to slightly more than 3 percent of capacity.
