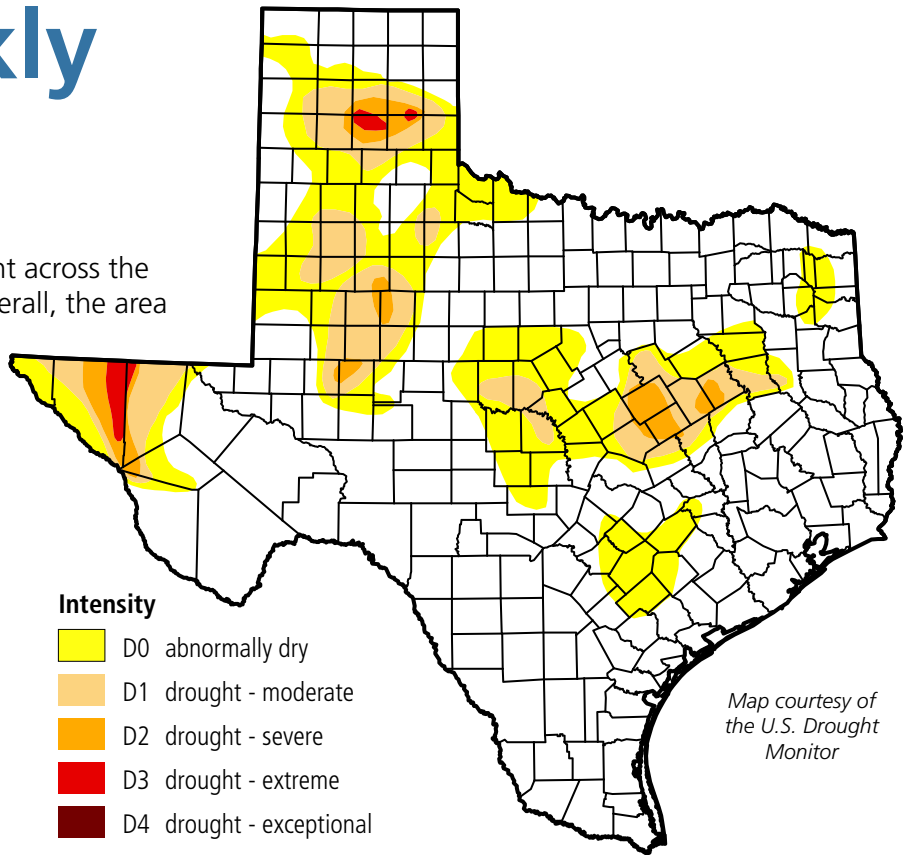

## Water conditions

The latest drought map shows improvement across the Panhandle, but little change elsewhere. Overall, the area of the state impacted by drought shrank 6 percentage points. Conditions look favorable for additional improvements next week, particularly in Central Texas.

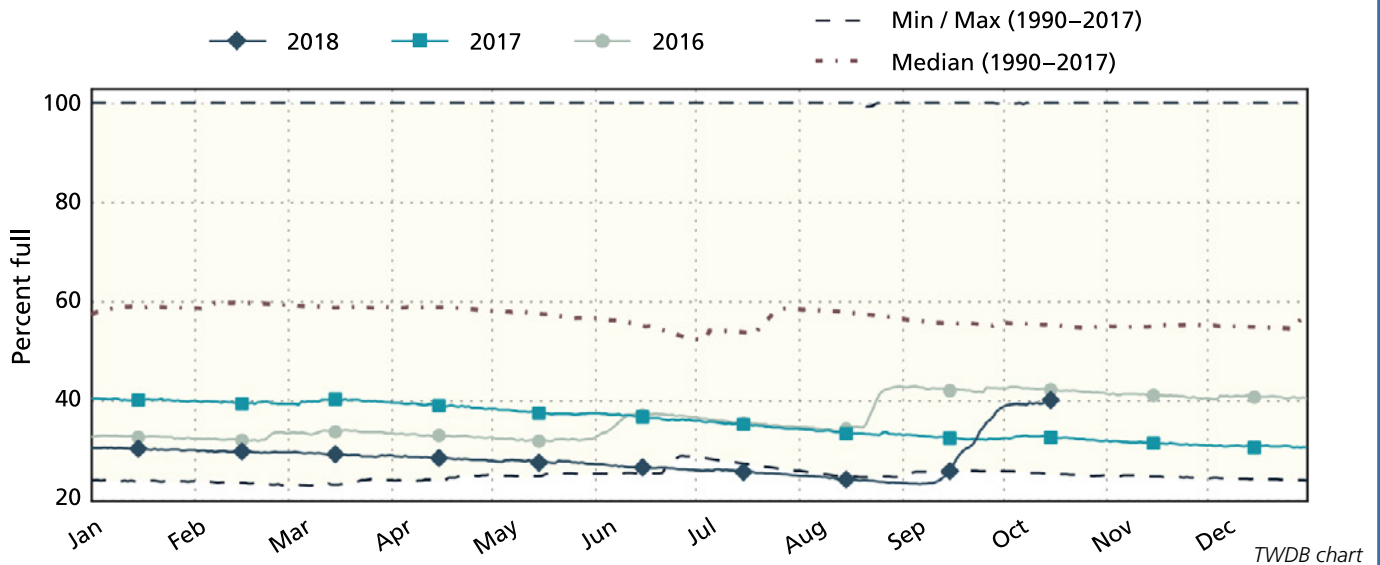
## Drought conditions

## Choke Canyon Reservoir storage hydrograph

Abundant rainfall in the upper watershed of the Frio River has increased the storage volume of Choke Canyon Reservoir in the last month. The reservoir is up more than 8 feet from historically low levels reached in mid-September but is still below normal for this time of year.
