

Dallas precipitation In an average 12-month June to May period, Dallas receives 37 inches of rainfall. For the 12-month period ending with May 2019, Dallas received a record 61.5 inches of rainfall. Dallas is poised to set similar 12-month rainfall records in June and July of this year. 18 Maximum
