

Water Weekly For the week of 09/07/20 Water conditions The latest drought monitor map for conditions as of September 1 shows a modest decrease in the total area of the state impacted by drought. Extreme or worse drought, however, crept up to 13 percent of the state, its largest value since August 2018.

September precipitation

The early days of September brought much needed rainfall to Central Texas. For example, areas near Lampasas and Waco have already received more precipitation this month than in the previous three months combined. Expect significant improvements in next week's drought map.
