


Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of May 10 shows continued contraction of drought in the northeast but continued intensification of drought along the central coast and in Central Texas. The area of the state impacted by exceptional drought climbed to 25 percent, its largest value in 8 years.

Drought conditions

- **♦** 79% now
- ♦ 80% a week ago
- ♦ 78% three months ago
- ♦ 44% a year ago





Midland and Snyder precipitation

May precipitation has been highly variable across the state. Through May 13, Midland hasn't received any measurable precipitation, continuing months of drought. Snyder, roughly 90 miles to the northeast, has received more than 3 inches of rainfall in May, more than their total for the previous 8 months combined.
