


Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of July 5 shows expansion and intensification of drought for the fifth consecutive week. Extreme or worse drought now covers 46 percent of the state, up from 40 percent in early June, but still below the mid-May peak of 56 percent.

Drought conditions

- ♦ 87% now
- ♦ 86% a week ago
- ♦ 85% three months ago
- ♦ 6% a year ago





Frio River at Concan

Months of drought in the Hill Country have reduced stream flows to extremely low values. The Frio River at Concan, for example, is on pace for its lowest annual stream flow since 1956. Flows at that location this year are well below those experienced in 2011.
