


Water conditions

The latest drought monitor map, for conditions as of April 4, shows little expansion but continued intensification of drought, particularly in Central Texas and the Panhandle. The area of the state impacted by extreme or worse drought reached 19 percent, its largest value since August 2022.

Drought conditions

- ♦ 67% now
- ♦ 67% a week ago
- ♦ 50% three months ago
- ♦ 85% a year ago





April precipitation

Precipitation in April has been hit or miss. The first nine days of the month brought more than two inches of precipitation to a broad swath of the state from the far south to the northeast. West Texas, the Panhandle, and much of Central Texas, however, remained dry.
