


Water conditions

The area of the state impacted by drought has decreased consecutively for 10 weeks. The latest drought map, for conditions as of June 6, shows that drought now impacts the least area of the state since October 2021. But severe or worse drought continues to grip 10 percent of the state.

Drought conditions

- ♦ 28% now
- ♦ 34% a week ago
- ♦ 79% a year ago





May precipitation

Texas received an average of 4.20 inches of precipitation across the state in May. That's about one inch more than normal for the month. Rainfall was particularly abundant in the Panhandle where some locations received more than 10 inches, more than four times the normal amount for the month.
