


Water conditions

The area of the state impacted by drought increased for the seventh consecutive week. Areas of West, North Central, and East Texas experienced one class of drought degradation. Drought has reached its largest extent since early May and looks primed to continue growing in the coming weeks.

Drought conditions

- ♦ 52% now
- ♦ 49% a week ago
- ♦ 54% three months ago
- ♦ 97% a year ago





June-July temperature and precipitation

With a statewide average of 3.27 inches of precipitation and average temperature of 84.3°F, 2023 was the third driest and warmest June-July for Texas since 2000. Only June-July 2011 and 2022 have been hotter and drier.
