

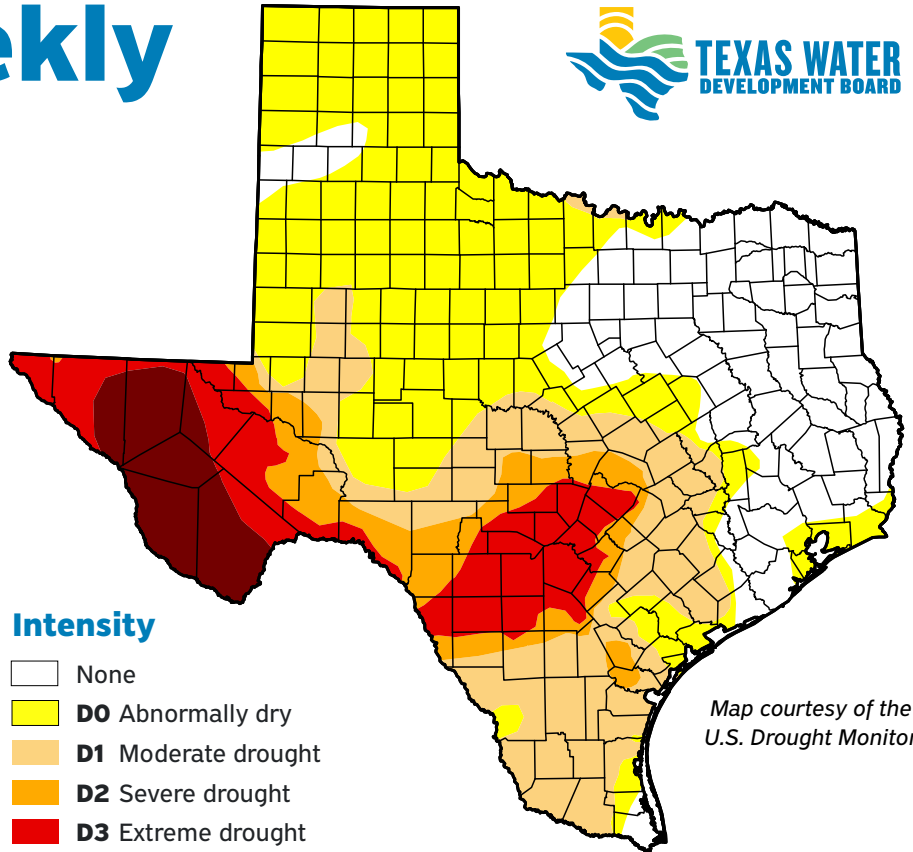

Water conditions

Recent rains have fallen predominantly in areas already free from drought. As a result, the latest drought map for conditions as of February 11 shows more drought than last week. The area considered “Abnormally dry” increased five percentage points and now covers about one-third of the state.



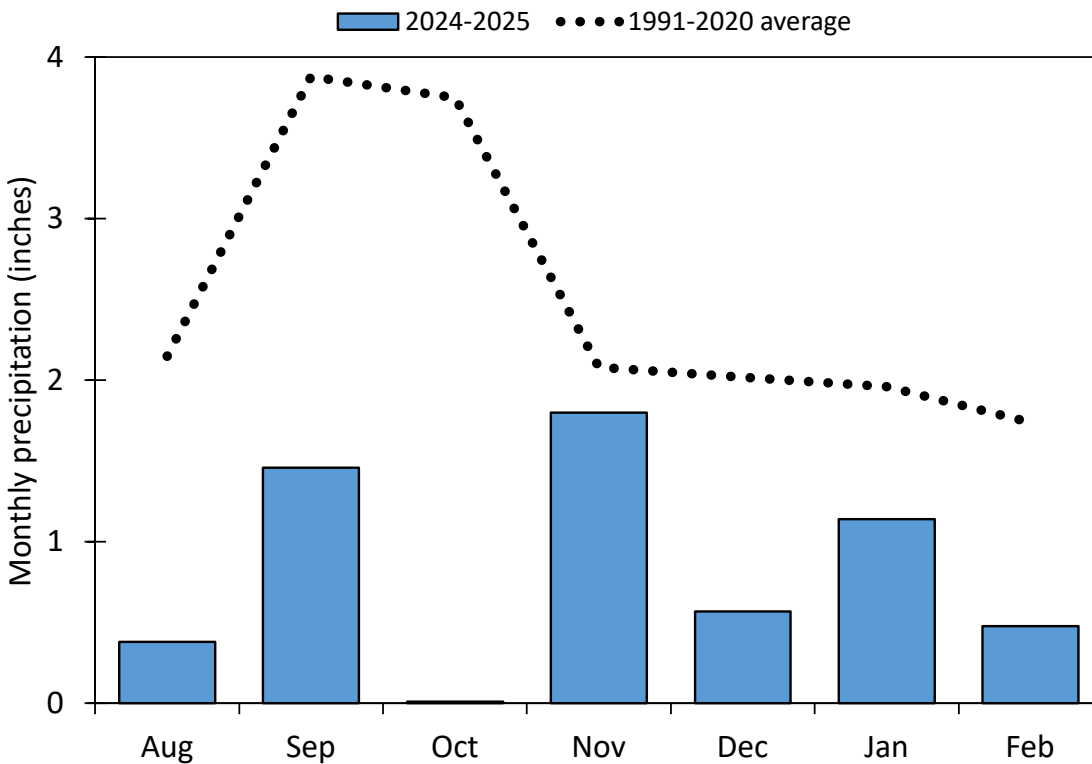

San Antonio precipitation

Total precipitation for San Antonio from August 2024 to January 2025 was 5.84 inches, the third driest August to January since 1949. Only August 2005 to January 2006 (4.40 inches) and August 1955 to January 1956 (5.04 inches) were drier. February 2025 is also on pace for below-average precipitation.
